construction of four inch internal di-  
ameter cast iron water main supply  
pipe, together with necessary connec-  
tions, shut off valves and special cast-  
ings in, along and under Burtis Av-  
enue, from the east city limits of  
Highwood westerly to the junction  
of said Burtis Avenue with Oak Av-  
enue; and along Oak Avenue from  
its junction with Burtis southerly  
to the junction of said Oak Avenue  
with Michigan Avenue, and in and  
along Elm Avenue from Burtis Av-  
enue southerly to the northerly en-  
d of the present water main in Elm  
Avenue, in the City of Highwood,  
Lake County, Illinois. The ordinance  
for same being on file in the office  
of the City Clerk of said City, and  
having applied to the County Court  
of Lake County for an assessment  
for the cost of said improvement
