P. T. A. Summer Campaign The United States Bureau of Education and the National Congress of Parents and Teachers are co-operating in a campaign to secure the entrance into the first grade of school of children 100 per cent perfect in health, in September 1925.

Children who can not see the blackboard, who can not hear the teacher's voice, who have not had sufficient sleep; who are under-nourished or are otherwise physically handicapped are at a disadvantage in a school where other children are physically sound and mentally alert.

Parents should be warned by the number of children falling by the number of children falling to pass out of the first grade each year and should prepare their own children during the summer months by having all defects of teeth, ears, eyes, nose and throat corrected.

All P. T. A.'s are urged, therefore, to join this campaign to send 100 per cent perfect children to school in September by calling your members together in each school district to discuss the question of the preparation of the children for school life; by securing the co-operation of the newspapers in your community in a press campaign to awaken parents to the needs of their children at this time and by any other means, during July and August, that may be possible in order to secure the attention and action of parents and teachers.

Parent-teacher associations are urged to act quickly in this campaign; to form committees for special work; to outline a program for each week and carry it out; and to reach, in some way, every home in the school district in which there are children who expect to enter school in September for the first time.

The National President has issued the following letter: TO PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATIONS: The co-operation of the United States Bureau of Education in the campaign to send to school in the first grade, in September, 1925, children who are 100 per cent free from remedial defects has added great strength to the movement.

This campaign is not intended as a substitute for the health activities in operation in many communities, but rather as an auxiliary to them. Hitherto, the task of securing physical perfection in the scholars has been left largely to the schools and to the health authorities.

The nine hundred thousand organized parents and teachers of the United States now propose to see that the home assumes its rightful responsibility, and sends to the school pupils ready to be taught, instead of bundles of parental mistakes to be corrected. If the parents make use of the vacation months as a preparation period, the school term will not be interrupted by absences for repairs.

It is not proposed that parent-teacher associations conduct health clinics or assume any medical responsibility. The campaign is intended primarily to secure the action of parents to correct those defects which, when neglected, cause absence from school or inefficient class work, such as faulty conditions of eyes, ears, nose, throat, posture and nutrition, and next, to obtain the assistance of these aroused parents to spreading throughout their school districts a knowledge of the campaign and a general co-operation in carrying it on.

The certificate to be issued to associations taking part in this campaign will be signed by the United States Commissioner of Education and by the President of the National Congress of Parents and Teachers. One type of certificate will be issued to the association entering and carrying through the campaign and another type will be awarded to the association securing a 100 per cent perfect entering class of children according to the conditions of the campaign which have been furnished to each association.

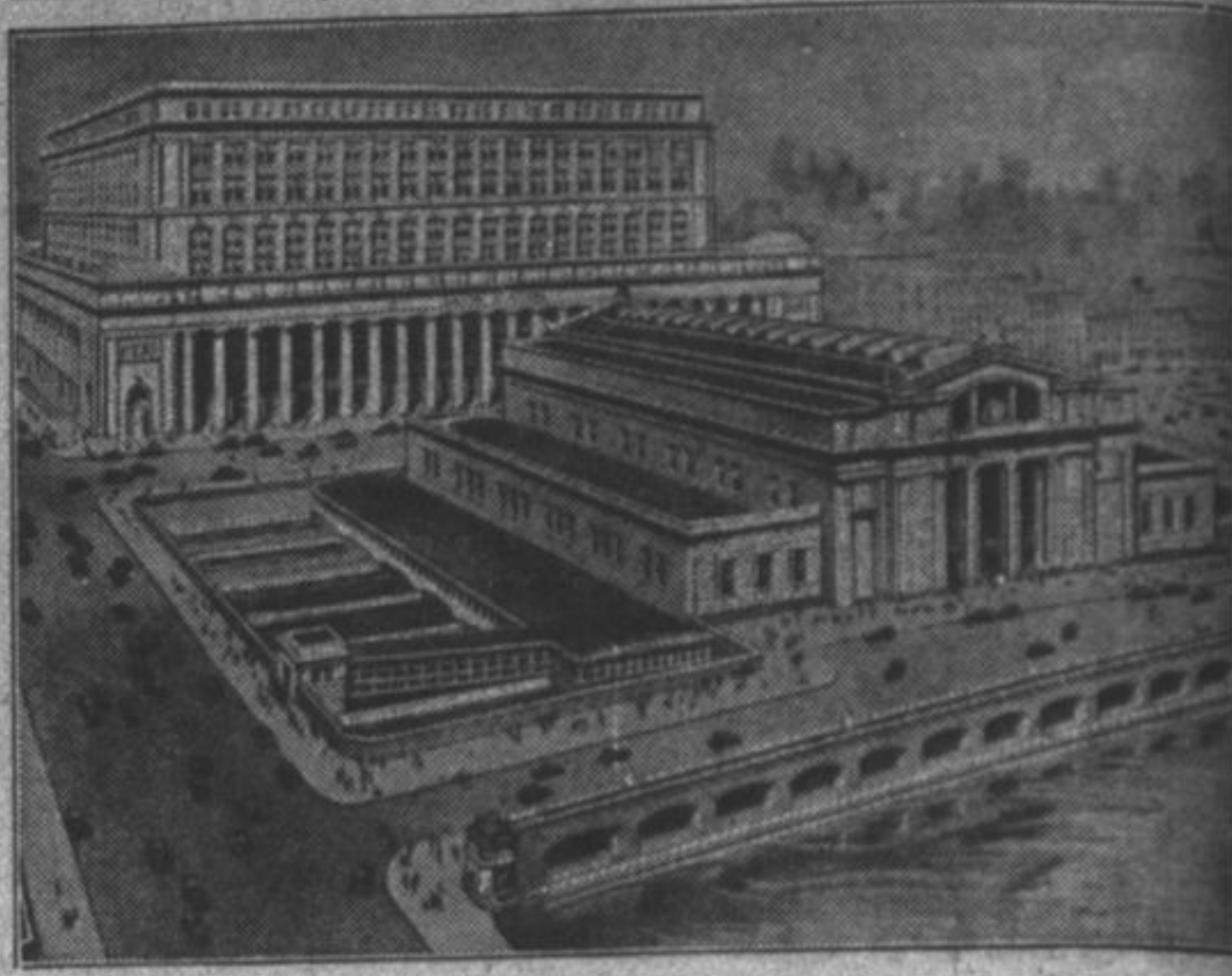
