The entire terminal building covers more than 35 acres. Fifteen acres of land were used in the various coverings over the train sheds, which are more than 1,200 feet beyond the main structure. A total of 600 tons of structural steel, 175,000 cubic feet of Indiana limestone, 10,000 cubic feet of granite are used in the station building and course. The foundation consists of 449 cylindrical concrete piers in four to ten feet in diameter, reaching to a depth of more than 20 feet below the level of the Chicago river. 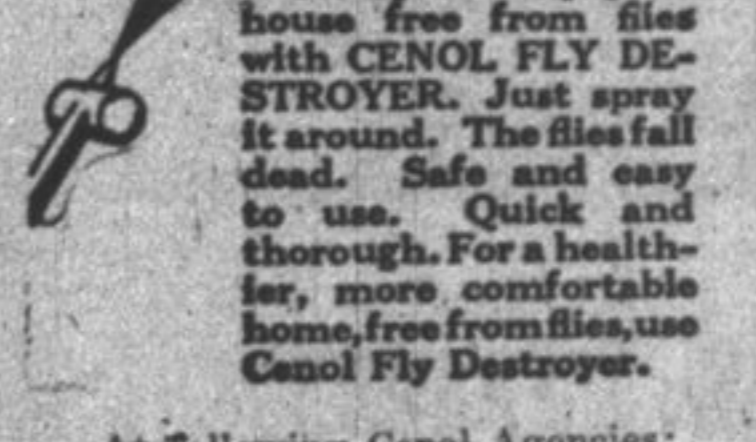

Four Concrete Hoppers Will Replace Frame Sheds North of Elm Place Crossing

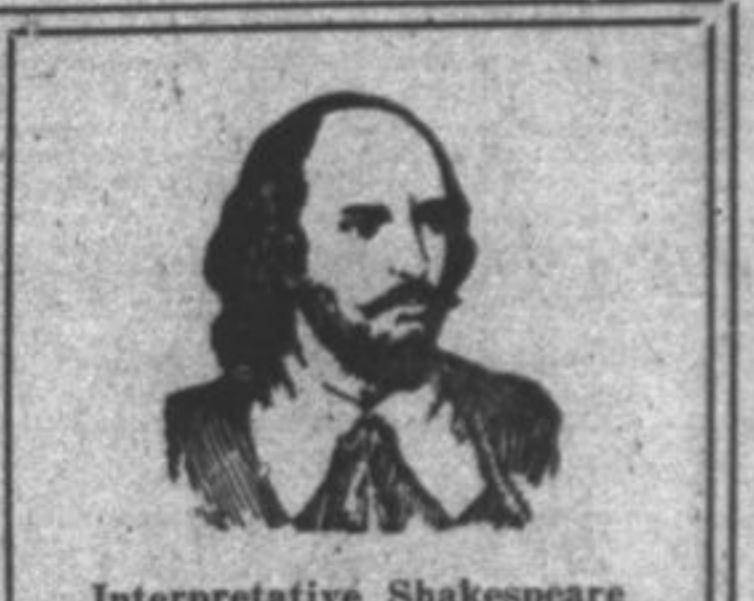
