Giordano Paltrinieri, Gennaro Papi will conduct. At Sunday afternoon's concert by the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Jacques Gordon will be heard as soloist. The seats for these concerts are free.

Monday Night Concert  
Monday night the Chicago Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Eric DeLamar, will give the weekly symphony concert. Miss Merle Alcock, mezzo soprano and Alfred Wallenstein, cellist, will be the soloists. The reserved seats are free for these concerts.

"Mason" with Lucrezia Bori in the title role and Tito Schipa as Chevalier Des Grieux is scheduled for Tuesday night. Leon Rothier will be heard as the elder Des Grieux. Mme. Bori and Mr. Schipa have created a furor whenever they have appeared in this tuneful romance of devotion and selfishness. The two leading roles give both of these principals the opportunity for singing and acting of the kind for which they are especially endowed and which makes broad appeal. Others in the cast are Desire Defrere, Louis D'Angelo, Giordano Paltrinieri, Margery Maxwell, Philine Falco, Merle Alcock, Paolo Ananian, and Virginia Grassi. Louis Hasselmanns will conduct.

Again Mme. Raisa is to be heard in the title role of "Madame Butterfly," this Puccini opus, which has been a prime favorite this season, being announced for Wednesday night. There are few roles in Mme. Raisa's repertoire which this soprano finds more congenial or which she interprets more subtly than that of the little Japanese heroine of this appealing work. Mario Chamlee, who has demonstrated himself one of the finest of the Pinkertons will again sing that part and Mario Bastola will be heard as Sharpless. Others in the cast are Ina Bourskaya, Giordano Paltrinieri, Paolo Ananian, Louis D'Angelo, Philine Falco and Virgilio Coscia. Gennaro Papi will conduct.

Children's Concert  
An excellent program has been arranged for the children's concert and entertainment on Thursday afternoon, the Chicago Symphony Orchestra being conducted by Eric DeLamar. Miss Bertha L. Hes has arranged and will direct the entertainment which is to be a folk festival and carnival, presented by the Children's Civic Theatre of Chicago. Children under twelve years of age are admitted free to these Thursday concerts and the reserved seats are free for everyone.

Offenbach's fantastic opera "The Tales of Hoffman" which was widely acclaimed when given its initial performance this season, will be presented again on Thursday night. Mme. Lucrezia Bori is to be heard as Giulietta and Antonia, a double role in which she scored heavily and Armand Tokatyian will be the Hoffman. Others importantly cast are Helen Freund as Olympia, Giuseppe Danise as Dapertutto, Leon Rothier as Dr. Miracle, Ina Bourskaya, Paolo Ananian, Leon Rothier, Louis D'Angelo, Giordano Paltrinieri and Philine Falco. Louis Hasselmanns will conduct.

As Delibes "Lakme" is one of the most popular coloratura operas of the entire field of music drama, the announcement of its initial presentation of the season comes as good news. This work is to be heard next Friday night with Mme. de Hidalgo in the title role and with Tito Schipa as Gerald. Mme. Hidalgo has never been heard as Lakme in these parts, but there is every reason to believe that she will find the florid coloratura arias of the role well suited to her. Tito Schipa, heard as Gerald on several occasions at Ravinia season before last has an international reputation as the young English officer who dared everything for love. Others in the cast are Desire Defrere as Frederick; Leon Rothier in the powerfully dramatic part of Nilakantha, Merle Alcock, Philine Falco, Margery Maxwell, Giordano Paltrinieri and Virginia Grassi. Louis Hasselmanns will conduct.

"The Masked Ball" Saturday  
Saturday night has been reserved for the initial Ravinia presentation of "The Masked Ball" which holds place as one of the greatest of the Verdi operas and yet which is seldom heard in this country despite its immense vogue in the opera houses of Europe. This is a work in which the dramatic element has been developed in typical Verdian style and which musically sets forth the tuneful arias, the brilliant ensembles and the smashing climaxes for which this composer is cited. An old tradition is being followed at Ravinia in giving this work its American locale—the early English settlement in the vicinity of Boston. Mme. Rosa Raisa is to be heard as Amelia, the wife who is unjustly accused; and Giovanni Martinelli is cast as Richard, count of Warwick. Both of these roles provide many dramatic moments and both demand dramatic singing of the sort that characterizes "Aida." It is interesting that neither Mme. Raisa nor Mr. Martinelli have appeared in their respective roles in about ten years. Giuseppe Danise as Renato also has a role which makes tremendous vocal

demands and provides opportunity for telling histrionism. Others in the cast are Florence Macbeth, as Oscar, a boy; Ina Bourskaya, Virgilio Lazari, Louis D'Angelo, Desire Defrere, Giordano Paltrinieri. Gennaro Papi will conduct.
