**COLLEGE BEQUEST  
MEMORIAL TO SON**

**Large Sum of Money Left to  
Lake Forest as John W.  
Barrell Trust Fund**

The bequest to Lake Forest college made by the late Mr. Finley Barrell in his will, which was admitted to probate last week, will be at least \$350,000—possibly nearer to half a million. The amount can not be definitely computed at this time, due to the terms of the will.

Mr. Barrell's estate was valued at \$755,000. Of this, there are the certain specific gifts to individuals and organizations mentioned in his will. These will probably total about \$400,000. The residue of the estate is to be held as a trust fund for Mrs. Barrell and a brother. After their death the fund will be transferred to Lake Forest college as a memorial to John W. Barrell, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Finley Barrell, who was drowned while on a vacation trip some years ago.

This generous remembrance in his will by the man who had been for so many years a next-door neighbor of the college came as a surprise to the officers of that institution. Mr. Barrell has never mentioned the fact that he intended the college among his beneficiaries.

**SHERIFF'S OFFICE IS  
PUZZLED BY SKELETON**

That the skeleton of a man found in a gravel pit near the Rosecrans road and the Fox river last week might have been killed by Indians some time in the dark, dim past, was the belief expressed by Deputy Sheriff Lester N. Tiffany, who has been making an investigation of the case.

According to Tiffany, no one in the vicinity of the town of Newport seems to have any recollection of the disappearance of a large, square-jawed man, and the fact that the upper part of the skull is missing, leads to the belief that he was tomahawked by the Indians or that his head was mashed in by some heavy object and that the crushing of this part of the skull made it disintegrate more rapidly than the other bones which were found firm and intact.

The body was found in the gravel pit that is located in a lonely and partially wooded spot right on the bank of the river. All indications point to a vivid picture of olden times and the white man's fight for supremacy.

The skeleton is still being kept at the sheriff's office and a disposition will be made of it within a few days.

**SCHOOL CHILDREN  
WRITE TO FRANCE**

From Paris, France comes word that a letter has been received from Elm Place school, class 8-A, Highland Park, Ill., U. S. A., and this letter has been turned over to the French Junior Red Cross, to give to a school, this fall.

A copy of the letter was sent to Miss Verall D. Wright, director of Chicago chapter Juniors, and it starts out—  
"We are anxious to get in touch with a country which we all want to visit. As this week is 'Good-Will Week' in local cities and towns, we thought we would write to some other country, and by a popular vote of the class, we chose France. We also thought it would be interesting to write to a country where one of our classmates, now our class president, went to school for a year."

The letter discusses the broadcasting station on Eiffel Tower; the Olympic games; the Riviera, "with its vineyards on one side and the Mediterranean on the other," and the Louvre. One paragraph is devoted to studies and the request that they write and tell about their school.

The letter is signed "Sincerely your friends for the furtherance of good will."  
Schools in 22 of the 35 countries in which the Junior Cross is organized are taking advantages of the international school correspondence offered by the Red Cross, to create friendly relations between school children.

**COLLEGE "Y" MEET  
AT LAKE FOREST**

The first annual conference of young people representing Y. W. C. A. and Y. M. C. A. organizations in colleges and universities all over the country will be held at Lake Forest college the week of September 5 to 11. These students are sent as delegates, with expenses paid by 150 colleges and universities in this country. There will be also a number from foreign countries. The visitors will be given the use of the college buildings. Their meetings will be held in the Durand Institute where men of national prominence will address the gathering. The public, it is expected, will be invited to attend some of the lectures.
