They both advanced on Little's sacrifice and Hessler scored on Werner's sacrifice fly. With two down Greisburn doubled and scored Glader. He went to third on F. Glader's single. They both scored on Duffy's double. M. Rudolph ended the rally by striking out.

Gerkin, who played third instead of Geo. Rudolph, scored a run in the fourth. He walked, advanced to second when Hessler drew his second pass and got to third on G. Glader's sacrifice and scored on Peterson's wild pitch.

In the lucky seventh the Elks put the game on ice. Hits by Little, Glader and Duffy mingled by an error scored three more runs.

The only run scored by Antioch came in the eighth when Hessler cased up. Moore doubled and scored on Peterson's hit.

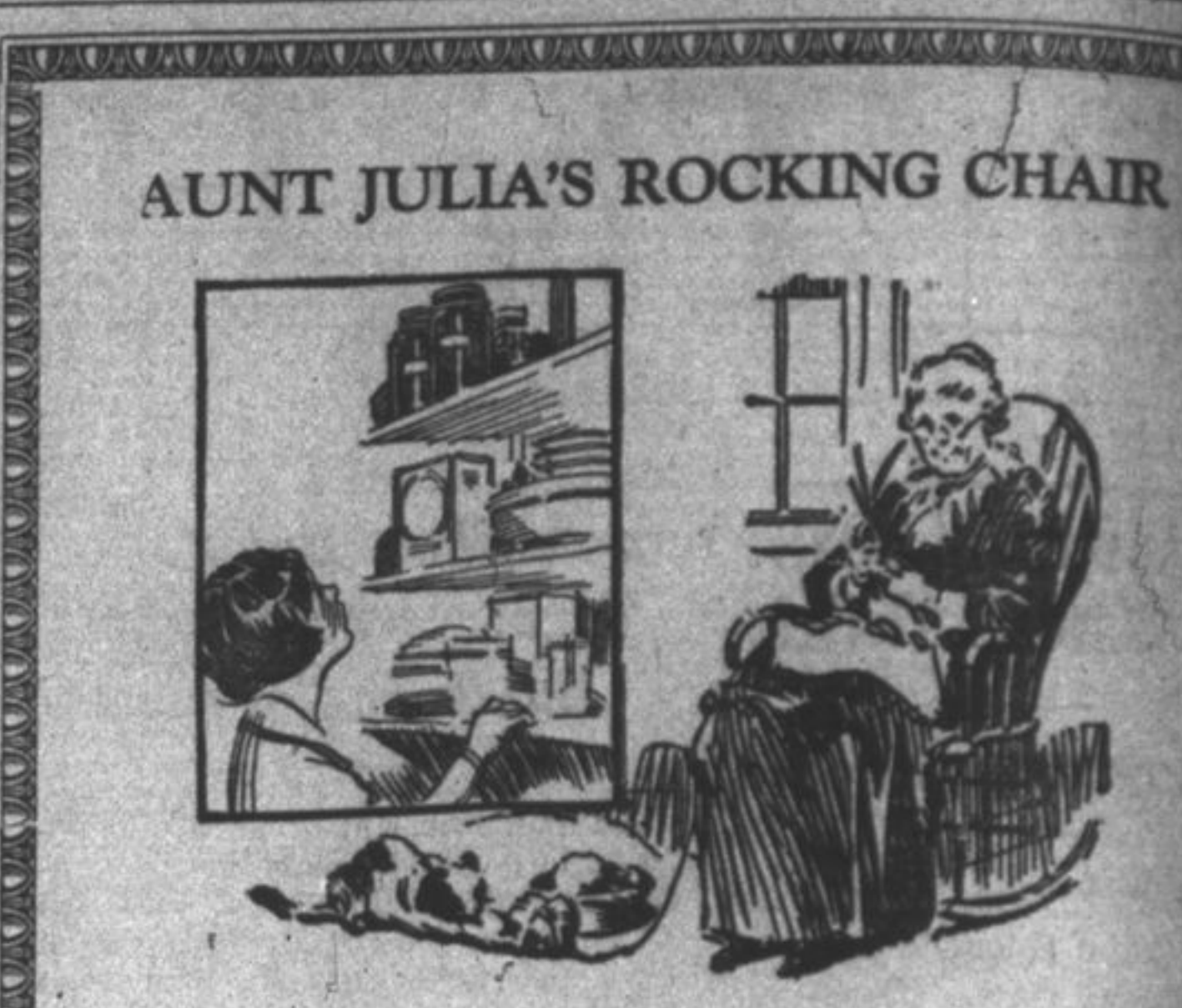
MAY OPEN COURSE BEFORE SEPT. 1ST
