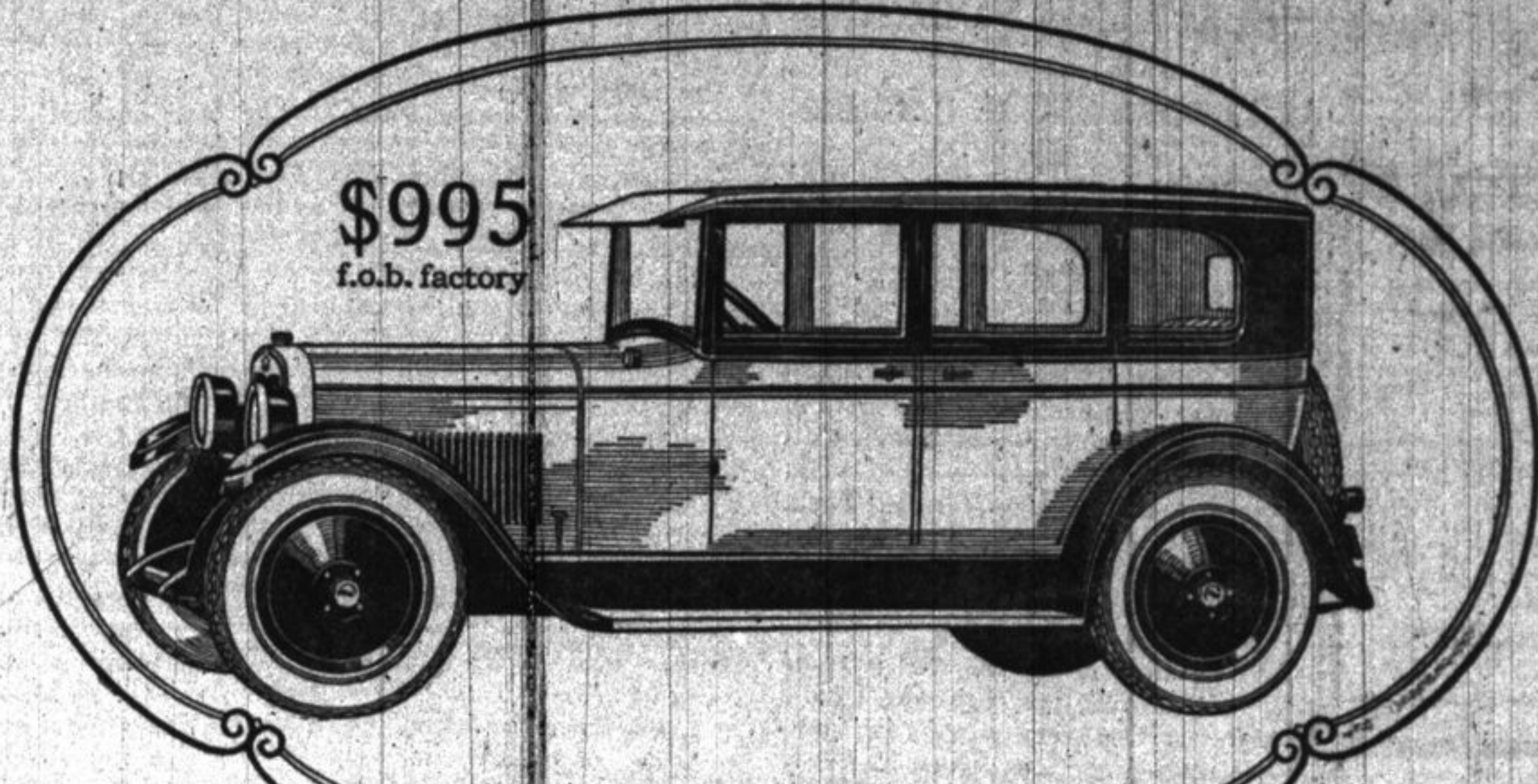

#### UNFAMILIAR ASPECTS OF NEW MOTOR LAWS

##### Chicago Motor Club Investigators Report Many Violations

Investigators for the Chicago Motor Club report that many motorists are not yet aware of the changes in the motor vehicle act that went into effect July 1, and that many violations are occurring because of ignorance of the new laws.

The provision of the motor vehicle act that prohibits the use of gongs, bells or whistles on any motor vehicle but police and fire apparatus, went into effect July 1. The investigators report many trucks and even passenger cars operating with whistles.

It is also reported that the law prohibiting the use of red or green lights showing in a forward position on motor vehicles is being violated.

Horse drawn vehicles are still found in the country without lights, and pedestrians are still walking on concrete roads with traffic instead of against it, as provided for by law.

Continuing their check on the less frequented country roads the club investigators found that the drivers having the wider road shoulder to their right do not always obey the law which provides that they shall give way to the vehicle approaching from the opposite direction on whose right is the narrower road shoulder. They found cars standing on roads where there was not room for two other vehicles to pass safely.

The old warning signs interpreting the speed law as dictated by the wishes of the various village authorities are to be a thing of the past, according to the Chicago Motor Club. The state highway department, under the new law, has the right to exercise authority over roads through towns if such roads are part of the state system of highways, and to erect suitable signs setting forth the various speed limits in the business, residential and out-lying districts.

According to word received by the club from Springfield, the highway department is now considering the erection of such signs. The department has been given jurisdiction over the traffic on these state highways through towns, and motor club officials believe that this will be a strong accident deterrent, and will tend to eliminate the speed trap evil.
