#### SING IN FINAL

IS TRIPLE CLOSING BILL

Eckstein Offers Popular Performance to 6,000 Music Lovers as Season Closes

More than 5,000 North Shore and Chicago residents heard the triple closing bill of the Ravinia opera season Monday evening. The brilliance of the final performance was a fitting climax to a season which more than ever before has been replete with the best both in the quality of the offerings and in the ability of the performers. The artists of the evening, singing as though inspired, gave the enthusiastic crowd, which crammed the standing and seating space as far as voice could carry, reason to regret the fact that Ravinia was closing; but hope for a new season in due course.

The first appearance on the evening program was Rosa Raisa in a new role, that of Cio-Cio-San in "Madame Butterfly." Giovanni Martinelli was cast as Pinkerton, Ina Bourskaya as Suzuki, Giacomo Rimini as Sharpless, Giordano Batrinieri as Goro and Paolo Ananias as the Bonze and Carlo Coscia as the Commissioner. The roster for the offering was completed with Gennaro Bapi as conductor.

The second offering presented "Manon", (second and third acts), with Lucrezia Bori singing the title role, Tito Schipa singing Des Grieux and Leon Rothler and Desire Defrere as the elder Des Grieux and Lescaut.

Following this, Bori and Schipa sang the Garden scene from "Don Pasquale", and the evening's program was concluded with the household scene from "Don Pasquale" presented by the chorus.

### RAVINIA CLUB HEARS WELL-KNOWN ARTISTS

Dorothy and Alynne Tudor Entertain Members of Woman's Club

A number of Highland Park women were guests of the Ravinia Woman's Club at their meeting in the club rooms yesterday afternoon. An unusual program was presented by the Misses Dorothy and Alynne Tudor, pianist and dramatic soprano, respectively. Their ability was the more remarkable because of the youth of the artists. Dorothy Tudor is 22 and her sister 17. They have frequently played for radio broad-casting. Each, in her field, possesses unusual ability and knowledge of her art. ### HIGHLAND PARK IS WELL PROTECTED CITY

One phase of fire insurance law not generally known is that part delegating part of the premium on each fire insurance policy toward the maintenance of the fire department in the town where the policy is written. The percentage allotted by law is two per cent of the premium paid. Those placing their insurance with out of town firms are therefore helping to maintain out of town fire departments. Thus a policy written in Chicago upon a building in Highland Park will pay toward the maintenance of the Chicago fire department two per cent of the total premium paid thereon, whereas if the policy is written in Highland Park, the local fire department benefits accordingly.

Recent reductions and increases in fire insurance rates in Chicago and suburbs in accordance with the fire risk or protection does not affect Highland Park, since the city remains in the favored class with low rates due to ample fire protection. Many sections of the city, once rated as unprotected because of absence of hydrants within a thousand yards, now take the lower rate as protected property because of the many installations of mains and water hydrants made within the last year or two.

### PRESIDENT SARGENT REINSTATES RACKS

Fred W. Sargent, new and ambitious president of the Northwestern railway, has hearkened to the loud voice of protest of the North Shore commuter and ordered the racks, recently removed from all suburban trains to make way for advertising placards, replaced for the convenience of suburbanites.

The removal of the racks followed an offer, reported to be of good proportions, from an advertising agency. But hot on the announcement of removal came protest in press and by letter, by delegation and ridicule, until President Sargent issued the formal order for reinstatement last Friday.

### NEW SERVICE STATION REPLACES LANDMARK

Corner St. John's and Park Avenues Site of McPherson Station

An historic landmark was removed when the old building at the corner of St. John's and Park avenues was torn down to make way for the new gas-filling station being installed by Leslie McPherson.

For many years the tottering structure was used as a blacksmith shop, in the days before the invasion of the automobile forced smithies out of business or into the automobile business. For a number of years a blacksmithing business was operated in the building by Johnson and Dahl. More recently the place was occupied by the James Collins' Paint Shop. The old building was none too good to look upon, however, for like most landmarks, it was rather moss-grown and tattered. The looks of the street and the corner will be greatly improved with the installation of a modern, well-lighted service station.

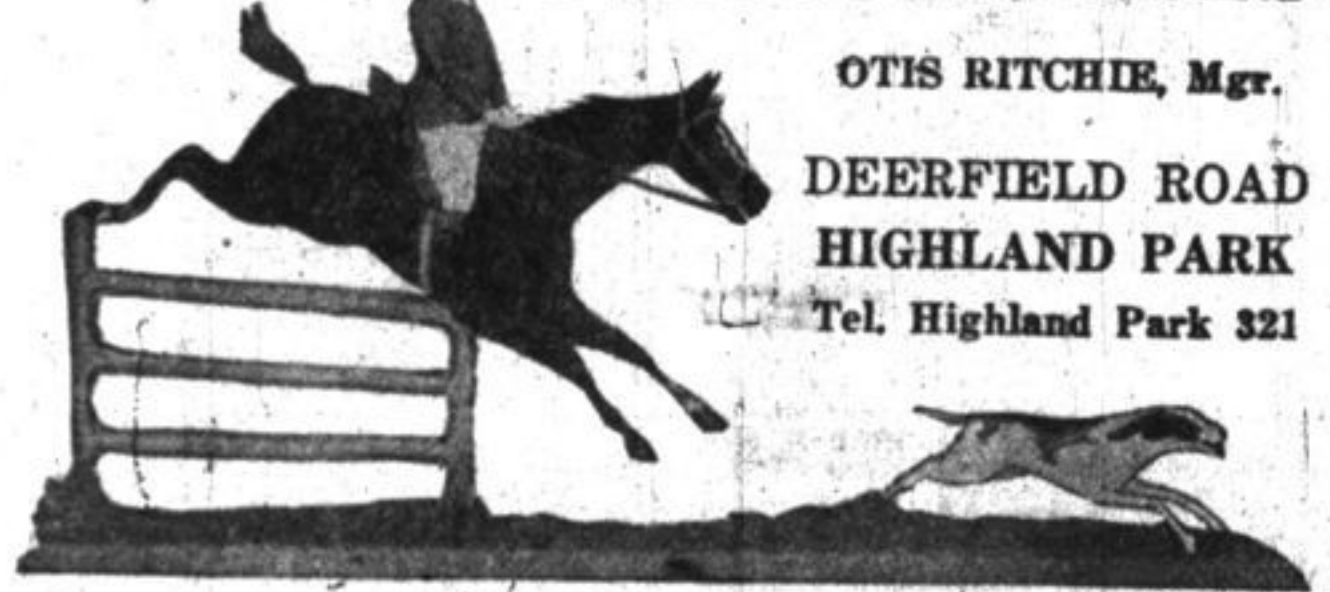
