WRECK SURVIVORS ARE SLOWLY RECOVERING

Peter Michaels Left Hospital Sunday; James Rietz Leaves Within Week

Peter Michaels, one of the survivors of the automobile wreck at Northbrook on Labor Day, left the Highland Park hospital Sunday greatly improved. Another survivor, James Rietz, whose father and brother were killed when a Chicago Milwaukee and St. Paul train struck their car, will be sufficiently recovered to leave within a few days, hospital authorities report.

The accident occurred when the four were crossing the tracks near Northbrook, enroute to Fox Lake for Labor Day vacation. Unable to see the approaching train, the driver had almost got across when the train struck the rear of the car, throwing it 150 feet. Those riding in the rear seat were killed. Michaels and James Rietz, in the driver's seat, were severely injured, but lived.
