PRaises SCOUT WORK IN LETTER TO PRESS

A scout mother, in the following letter to the Highland Park Press, lauds the work of the boys scouts and urges the parents to forward Girl Scout work in Highland Park.

I wonder if the thought that came to me last night at the Boy Scout rally has ever come to you and other mothers.

To begin with—I went upon the invitation of my son, but found on reaching the high school that I was the only woman there. I did not think I was wanted, but on turning to go was urged by one of the scouts to stay—that they needed mothers as well as fathers!

Whether this was scout policy or not I appreciated it very much and gained much by my stay.

What I really want to say is this—Our daughters through lack of a similar organization are losing a great deal which they should have as well as our sons.

The girl scouts can give them the same companionship—the same large outlook, the same high ideals as the boy scouts.

Whereas this national organization is not as old nor as large as the boy scouts, it can give and will give them what they need—if we mothers can be rounded to our part!

Can not we, the mothers and fathers of Highland Park girl scouts join together to do something in forwarding our girl scout organization to this very fine promise already shown by the boy scouts?
