"An accident on a country road is generally of a more serious nature than the same kind of accident in the city," says Charles M. Hayes, president of the Chicago Motor club. "For example, skidding on a city street and crashing into a curb may mean no more than a broken wheel; the same accident on a country road may mean sliding into a ditch, an overturned car, and possible tragedy.

"The unpardonable sin of country driving is to refuse to pull over to the right on signal from the rear. This is not only a violation of the rules of courtesy; it is a violation of a state law in Illinois, and in many other states.

ESTABLISH COURSES IN PUBLIC UTILITY

Establishment of new graduate courses in public utility finance and administration in addition to the utility courses studied by more than 100 students last year, has been announced by Charles M. Thompson, Dean of the College of Commerce of the University of Illinois.

The public utility companies' demand for university trained workers has brought a wide-spread interest among undergraduates, and although established only two years ago, the courses in principles, operation, management and regulation of public utilities have been among the most popular in the College of Commerce.

The twenty graduate students now doing advanced study in the economics of public utilities at the University of Illinois, probably constitute the largest group devoted to the study of a single course in any graduate school in the United States, according to the dean. Sixteen annual scholarships and fellowships ranging from \$400 to \$800 each are available to graduate students meeting the established requirements.


