It worked a hardship for both groups and would have been entirely unnecessary if we had some such clearing-house as I suggest. This confusion and waste in our community programs stays with us to the despair of anyone who is responsible for planning any special event in the life of Highland Park.

It would be an easy matter for the Highland Park Press to gather together the yearly programs of the various organizations of our town which plan events with a community appeal—the clubs, lodges, schools, churches, etc. One of the office staff could then compile a monthly calendar for publication in your paper. In case of conflict he could notify the organization affected in time for an adjustment. With the growth of our city we must have some such scheme for bringing order and proportion into our recreational and educational opportunities.

With this communication I forward to you the calendar of special activities, which the Presbyterian church expects to hold between now and next June. In case of a conflict with some other group I shall be only too eager to make an adjustment.
