**ANNUAL MEETING AT  
RAIL MEN'S HOME**  
Officers Elected; John O'Keefe  
Continues as Secy.-Treas-  
urer and Manager

On Monday, November 2, the So-  
ciety for the Home of the Aged and  
Disabled Railroad Employees of Am-  
erica held their annual meeting at  
the home at Highland Park.

Among those present were W. G.  
Lee, president, Brotherhood of Rail-  
road Trainmen; William B. Prenter,  
president, Brotherhood of Locomotive  
Engineers, who is a trustee of the  
home society; Harry P. Dougherty,  
vice-president, Brotherhood of Loco-  
motive Engineers; Timothy Shea,  
vice-president, Brotherhood of Loco-  
motive Firemen and Enginemen;  
Mary Cassell, president, Grand In-  
ternational Auxiliary to the Brother-  
hood of Locomotive Engineers; Sadie  
Scott, grand president, Ladies' So-  
ciety to the Brotherhood of Locomotive  
Firemen and Enginemen; A. E. King,  
general secretary and treasurer,  
Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen;  
A. H. Hawley, general secretary and  
treasurer, Brotherhood of Locomo-

William Kilpatrick of the Order of

Mr. Kilpatrick is a charter member  
of Division No. 1, Order of Railway  
Conductors, and the oldest living  
member of the order in point of mem-

Much important business was tran-  
sacted, of which might be mentioned  
an amendment to the home by-laws  
eliminating the Order of Railway  
Conductors, from further connection  
with the home movement. Also an  
amendment to the articles of incor-  
poration along the same lines.

The valuation of the home prop-  
erty as it now stands, given by the  
Chicago Real Estate Board, is \$369,-  
295.69. This includes the new addi-  
tion to the home, finished this year,  
costing approximately \$172,000.

The officers elected were William G.  
Lee, Cleveland, Ohio, president; Mary  
Cassell, Cleveland, Ohio, vice-presi-  
dent; Mary DuBois, Iowa, 2nd vice-  
president; and John O'Keefe, High-  
land Park, Illinois, secretary-treasur-  
er and manager. The trustees were  
A. E. King, A. H. Hawley and W. B.  
Prenter.

The report showed the home affairs  
to be in the very best condition, and  
77 breaking-down, old railroad men are  
being cared for at the present time.
