

**NATIONAL DEFENSE PLANS CONSIDERED**

Although the United States hopes for a peaceful history for many years to come, plans are continually being considered for the national defense, and the army proposals or a selective service law have now gone to the Joint Board of the Army and Navy for final ironing out before being presented to congress.

The original war department draft bill was prepared because of the need felt for such an act in working out detailed mobilization plans for the army. The defense act supplies authority for the peacetime framework of the three-field-army plan, which has now been twice subjected to muster tests, but is silent as to where the man power to fill up the ranks would come from in an actual war emergency.

The first rush would come as volunteers, many of them; but in mapping out a schedule for productive mobilization paralleling the industrial mobilization, for which the act also provided, army experts found it necessary to assume that a selective service act would be passed and be relied upon in attaining full military strength. The proposals now under consideration in the form of a proposed bill are based on those assumptions.

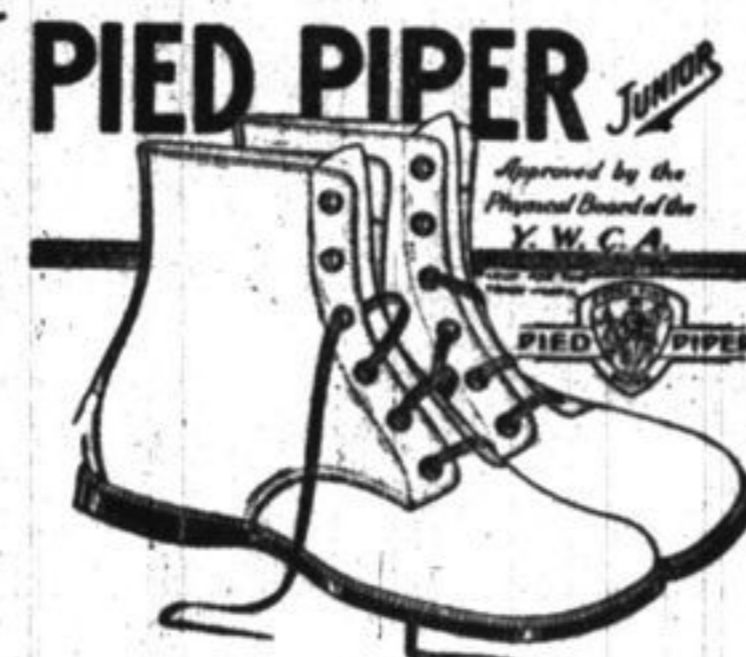
