WILMETTE MASONIC TEMPLE STONE LAID

CEREMONIES LAST SUNDAY

Prominent Masons Attend and Impressive Program is Carried Out; Fine Structure

Ceremonies attending the laying of the corner stone of the new Wilmette Masonic temple last Sunday afternoon was presided over by Richard C. Davenport, most worshipful grand master of Illinois, and his staff. A number of other Masonic notables of the state and representatives of all Masonic lodges within a twenty-five mile radius were in attendance at the ceremonies.

Chicago and Evanston Knight Templar drill teams and bands, units from Wilmette and other neighboring lodges, civic groups and local citizens participated in a street procession as a preliminary to the formal rites.

The new building is located in the civic center of the village on a tract of land, 107 feet by 200 feet, at 1010 Central avenue. The plans call for an auditorium on the first floor to seat 650. This room will be equipped with a large stage and adequate dressing-rooms. The auditorium will have a separate entrance so it can be used by the community for gatherings of all kinds without reference to the rest of the building.

All Facilities Club and recreation rooms, kitchen, pantry and serving rooms will also be located on the first floor. The main lodge hall with parlors, offices and property-rooms will be located on the second floor and a second lodge hall, parlors, utility-rooms, organ loft and a balcony opening above the main hall will occupy the third floor.

Three Wilmette fraternal organizations will use the new temple regularly. These are Wilmette lodge, No. 931, A. F. and A. M.; Wilmette chapter No. 253, R. A. M.; and Wilmette chapter No. 753, O. E. S. The new building will also be used as a community center and will be available for many purposes other than those of a Masonic character. Meetings of civic and social organizations, public assemblies, entertainments, public forums, will be welcomed, according to prominent officials of the lodge.
