DEPRECATES FEAR OF JAP REVOLUTION

OPINION OF INVESTIGATOR

Member of Pacific Relations Commission Declare That American-Born Japanese Are Loyal

Expressing the conviction that the United States need have no fear of a Japanese rebellion or uprising in Hawaii and that the younger Japanese who are born on American soil are largely patriotic and loyal Americans, John Tomlinson, who was a member of the American delegation to the Hawaii meeting on Pacific relations last July, told an audience at Northwestern university last week that much of the popular thinking, respecting Japan and her subjects, is unsound.

Mr. Tomlinson, who was graduated from Northwestern last year, has made a special study of far eastern questions with respect both to Japan and China. His journey to Hawaii afforded him an exceptional opportunity to look into the Japanese situation there; meanwhile he has done much reading and personal research regarding Chinese problems.

Rather Amazing
"It is rather amazing to one who has heard talk in the United States respecting the danger lurking in Hawaii and in the Pacific states from the Japanese to discover that the sons and daughters of Japanese citizens, born on our soil, rapidly take on our cultural and national thought," said Mr. Tomlinson, in addressing a large audience in Harris Hall. "My positive conviction is that these Japanese youngsters are bound to be as good American citizens as any of our own folks in the middle west."

"Regarding China, it is doubtless true that many of her ills are the results of the mistakes of her own political leaders but these leaders do not represent the mass of the people. I am sympathetic with the contention of the younger Chinese that a stable and trustworthy central government be established in China with power to regulate tariffs and to abolish extra-territoriality courts so that China may throw off foreign influences and leap forward as an enlightened nation."

In California
Mr. Tomlinson said that the Japanese question in California is largely political; that the recent act of congress, far from remedying immigration ills, merely angered the Japanese people at home and did not alter conditions in the United States one whit. He argued that Californians need have no great fear of the Japanese there when they own outright only 26,000 acres of land; and own or rent only 360,000 acres of land compared with a total acreage of 28,140,000 in the state of California.

COW BEATS AUTO IN EFFICIENCY

The dairy cow is a more efficient worker than the automobile. This is the comeback of Dr. C. H. Eckles, noted dairy expert, to the charge of Henry Ford that the cow is an "inefficient machine" which he hoped would be displaced by a "Scientific cow giving synthetic milk." Dr. Eckles is chief of the division of dairy husbandry of the University of Minnesota and a lecturer of the Radio Farm school of the Blue Valley Creamery Institute.

"A comparison of the dairy cow and the automobile will show that the dairy cow is really the more efficient machine," states Dr. Eckles. "I am told by engineers that with the automobile joggling along under ordinary road conditions, only 15 per cent of the actual power of gasoline is used. Even poor cows return more than 15 per cent of their food in milk."

Dr. Eckles doubts that Mr. Ford's suggestion of a scientific cow giving synthetic milk will ever be realized. "The most skilled chemist cannot make any of the half dozen food constituents found in milk," he says. "All of these are absolutely necessary to the human diet. As far as history goes back, some 6,000 years, milk has been one of the chief foods of mankind, and there is no reason for believing that it will not continue to be equally important in the future."
