munity partly through the drive  
knows what the hospital has to offer  
and has availed itself of the facili-  
ties to a much greater extent.  
This work of education must con-  
tinue, and greater publicity should be  
given to the hospital, its work and its  
needs.  
In February we all sustained a se-  
vere blow in the loss of Miss Olive  
A. Williams, the superintendent, who  
had built up the institution from a  
small beginning to its entry into its  
present larger sphere of usefulness.  
In commemoration of Miss Wil-  
liams and her work Mrs. Adams and  
Mrs. Wiegand have established a  
memorial flower bed and the Wom-  
an's Auxiliary have placed a mem-  
orial tablet on the door of the room  
which was hers. Both of these are  
very lovely memorials.  
In April we were most fortunate in  
securing Miss Elizabeth Thomas as  
Superintendent, and I take this op-  
portunity of expressing our unquali-  
fied appreciation of and thanks to  
Miss Thomas for her untiring efforts  
and loyal co-operation.  
A most successful baby clinic has  
held on May 12th, national hospital  
day. It is our aim to group all health  
activities around the hospital as a  
center, and through the co-operation  
of the board of health, visiting nurses  
association, and other organizations  
of a kindred nature, we feel that a  
good start has been made along these  
lines. Dental and baby clinics are  
now held regularly and our efforts  
will be to increase these spheres of  
usefulness.  
Your board wishes to make public  
acknowledgment of the establishment  
of the Charles T. Boynton Memorial  
Fund—\$25,000 given by the family  
of the late Mr. Charles T. Boynton,  
the interest to be used for hospital  
purposes. Mr. Boynton during his  
life was very interested in and large-  
ly responsible for the starting of this  
institution, and this fund is a very  
beautiful and generous act on the  
part of his family.  
The need for additional space for  
housing the nurses has been so evi-  
dent for some time and this situation  
has become much more serious of  
late. To correct this shortage and to  
provide a site which in time could be  
improved with an up-to-date nurses'  
home and possibly a training school  
if the need should arise, your board  
has purchased since the close of the  
fiscal year, the house and one hun-  
dred foot lot on the north side of  
Glenview avenue opposite the hospi-  
tal—the purchase price was \$15,000  
and the Woman's Auxiliary  
have donated \$1,000 as a special sur-  
scription toward the purchase. It is  
hoped that as payments fall due,  
donations from other sources will be  
made to aid in this well worth while  
undertaking.  
In this connection I would be re-  
miss if I did not express the manage-  
ment's great appreciation of the loy-  
alty of the nurses. They have car-  
ried on under, many times, most try-  
ing circumstances and we owe them  
at least comfortable quarters and it  
should be our aim to secure these at  
as early a date as possible.  
The hospital personnel in all de-  
partments has been most loyal and it  
has been a great pleasure to work  
with such an organization.  
The medical staff has co-operated in  
every way and their constant aim  
has been the improvement of the  
service and the standing of the hospi-  
tal. Largely through their efforts the  
institution is accredited and is  
very fortunate in having three in-  
ternes whose work is excellent.  
It is impossible to praise too high-  
ly the Woman's Auxiliary. Both as  
individuals and as an organization  
they have been a great help, unpar-  
ing in giving their time, efforts and  
money, and the hospital is indeed  
blessed in having such loyal women  
interested in its activities and well-  
fare.

**Treasurer's Report**  
The treasurer, Mr. George W. Ros-  
etter, reported as follows:  
The complete audited statement is  
on file, but I shall give you only a  
summary of the report so that you  
may have the salient points in mind.  
The patients admitted during the  
last 12 months were 1125, compared  
to 729 for the year previous, or an  
increase of 396. The days' treatment  
were 8840, an increase of 2177 over  
the year before, and the average pa-  
tients per day were 24 as compared  
with 18 the previous year.  
The income for the 12 months end-  
ing August 31, 1924, and 1925, com-  
pare as follows:

Operating expenses  
inc. depreciation

& organization 88,392.70 65,407.37  
Deficit for year \$ 7,733.39 \$18,044.98  
The balance sheet as at August 31,  
1925, shows current assets less re-  
serves of \$16,672.17 and current li-  
abilities of \$8,420.53.  
The fixed assets stand on the books  
as \$237,461.73 with no mortgage debt  
against the property.  
In passing, I might mention that  
there are still due and unpaid, \$1835  
pledged for the building fund and  
\$1501.24 on the maintenance fund  
due April 1, 1925.  
It is hoped that these payments will  
be made at an early date and that  
the maintenance pledges due in 1926  
will all be paid as the hospital can  
be much better managed if its in-  
terest charges are kept down to a  
minimum and advantage taken of all  
discounts.
