MORE RURAL FREE DELIVERY ROUTES

Four Hundred and Ninety-Eight Added During the Last Fiscal Year

Four hundred and ninety-eight new rural free delivery routes have been established during the fiscal year just ended. Extensions were made in the scope of 228 existing routes. The total number of rural routes now crisscrossing the nation is 45,189, and in the territory covered by these rural carriers are served approximately 30, 000,000 persons, and these deliverers of letters, packages, etc., cover each year 1,223,391 miles.

This is a type of service which deserves encouragement and it is one of the activities of the post office de-partment which helps to make us all feel more lenient towards the annual deficiency.
