## GREAT LAKES MAY GET FINE FOUNDATION

GIFT HAS BEEN ACCEPTED

Liberty Drivers Alliance Will Give Fine Decorative Piece For New Hospital There Is Reported

With a letter of acceptance from Brig. Gen. Frank T. Hines, director of the United States veterans' bureau the fountain and pergola at the neuro-psychiatric hospital, at Great Lakes, offered by the U. S. Liberty Drivers Alliance of Chicago is assured. A few details remain to be settled as to design, after which work will be started.

Mrs. Sidney Dillon Goldenberg, president of the organization, announced this progress recently.

"Permit me at this time to express, in behalf of the bureau and its beneficiaries, my earnest appreciation of your interest in the bureau work as so distinctly evidenced by your gracious gift," Gen. Hines wrote.

**Fountain in Horseshoe Court**  
The fountain will be in the horseshoe court around which the buildings of the large new hospital are being laid out. It will be covered by a pergola so that it may be accessible to the invalid soldiers at all times. A suitable bronze tablet will be placed on it.

Work on the hospital is progressing rapidly and it is hoped that the first patients can be received not later than Christmas. Contract calls for Jan. 16 as the opening date.

Members of the Liberty Drivers alliance are making plans for largely increasing their work with the opening of the hospital and the concentration of the patients who heretofore have been scattered in numerous institutions.

The alliance is one, if not the only, organization to keep its wartime strength and put in as strenuous efforts for the sufferers of the war now as they did during 1917 and 1918.

## LOCARNO TREATIES FOR LASTING PEACE

### EUROPE HOPING ANYHOW

Through These Agreements Great Britain Again Assumes the Leadership in European Affairs

Great Britain, through the treaty of Locarno, assumed the leadership in European affairs, scrapped the Geneva protocol and sent the League of Nations back into the corner, according to Albert H. Laidlaw, in the current number of the National Republic. Among other things Mr. Laidlaw says:

Having scrapped the Geneva protocol of arbitration, security and disarmament by her refusal to ratify it, thus further weakened the inherently weak league of nations, Great Britain, by her diplomacy at the Locarno conference, has relegated the league into the second class as an instrumentality of European peace and security, and has set up in place of it a first class instrument more responsive to the fine Britanic hand which fashioned it and will control it. The security treaties negotiated at Locarno restore Great Britain to her old place of dominance, re-establish the Concert of Europe which the World War had thrown into a discord of wild jazz, and give a very strong hope, if not unqualified assurance, of another substantially durable period of harmony under the baton of a venerable and experienced conductor commonly known as John Bull.

For Lasting Peace

"Preceded by the Dawes plan as the first approximately practicable step in the direction of economic rehabilitation in Europe, the arbitration and security treaties just concluded at Locarno are the first approximately practicable moves in the direction of a lasting peace among the great powers of Europe since the armistice of 1918. It would be a foolhardy prophecy to say that these treaties mean perpetual peace for Europe, but it is perfectly reasonable to hope and to expect that, by reason of them, the world's next great war is, to say the least, remote. Wars have not ended, and only fools and blind men expect them to be ended. But the peril of another cataclysm has been reduced to a minimum; British reconciliation not merely with Germany, but with France, witnesses the enthronement of a real balance of power, and that is the best peace guaranty Europe can have this side of that millennial era of the invisible future when men cease to be men and become instead, lambskins or angels."
