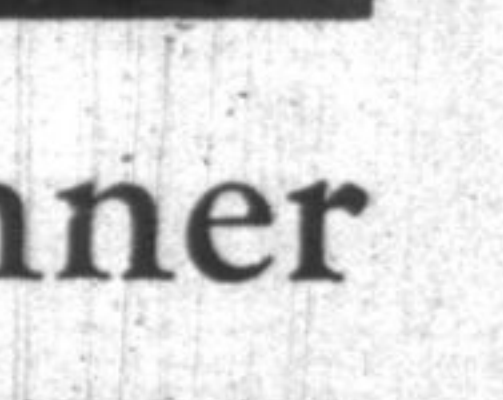

**LOSES TO LINDBLOM**  
Both Heavies and Lights Defeated Last Saturday; Austin Team Here Next

Lindblom's basketball team defeated Deerfield-Shields cagers twice last Saturday in the opening games of the season for the losers. The lights, were trampled on 20-5, and the heavies were defeated 19-13.

The Deerfield lights were never dangerous after the first quarter, which ended with the score 4-1 against them, and at no time during the game held the lead. Soon after the start of the second quarter Lindblom made a spurt and sank three baskets in rapid succession. The half ended with the score 12-2 against Deerfield, their other point coming from a free throw by Davis.

Ganeberg made Deerfield's only goal from the floor, sinking a long one early in the third quarter. Johnson starred for Lindblom. There was much fouling throughout the game.

**GIVEN IN CHICAGO**  
McCutcheon Production to Be Staged by Theatre at Art Institute

When the Spanish comedy, "The Romantic Lady" comes off the boards at the Goodman theatre, Art Institute, it will be followed by a novel enterprise, the production of John T. McCutcheon's "An Heir at Large," which has been made into a play by Mary Aldis. The first performance of the play will be given on Thursday, December 17, and will be followed by regular Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evening performances and Friday matinees.

The property consists of about three and one-half acres and is located at Vine street and Ravine place. This site was purchased by the late John A. Roche about the year 1886 for \$2,500, and was by him improved. The property was bought by Mrs. Katherine Adamson for \$105,000, according to Waukegan reports, and is to be improved next spring with a residence. Mrs. Adamson is one of the Bowman heirs. The sellers were represented by Eli B. Felsenthal of the firm of Felsenthal, Struckmann and Berger and Albert G. Welch of Sims, Welch, Godman and Stransky, while the purchaser was represented by Samuel S. Holmes of McNab and Holmes.

**CYRUS McCORMICK'S FINE GIFT TO Y. W.**  
Christmas Present to Association in Memory of Wife; Is Building

A Christmas gift from Cyrus H. McCormick and his sons of the handsome residence building in Chicago for women and girls was announced last week at a city-wide meeting of the board members and staff of the Young Women's Christian Association. It is to be a memorial to Mr. McCormick's wife, the late Harriet Hammond McCormick. The ten-story building will occupy the association property at the northeast corner of Dearborn and Oak streets, and will cost approximately \$1,000,000.

"For some time my sons and I have been desirous of establishing a memorial to my dear wife," Mr. McCormick said in a letter to the association. "We have sought for a work that could be done in her name for women and girls, and have now concluded that we should like our memorial to be a residence for women, given to and conducted by the Young Women's Christian Association of Chicago."

**MAIL PLANES SOON MAY BE SEEN HERE**  
Plan Considered to Start Service Between Chicago and Minneapolis

If present plans are culminated, government mail airplanes soon may pass over this part of Lake county on their regular trips.

Definite steps toward starting the air mail route between Chicago and Minneapolis via Milwaukee are being taken by national air transportation companies, it is indicated by the announcement that a representative is to make a survey of Milwaukee.

The representative is L. K. Bell, traffic manager of the National Air Transport company of New York. He will be the guest of the Association of Commerce of Milwaukee. It is believed that Mr. Bell is going to Milwaukee to decide on the advisability of his organization bidding for the new route which the postoffice department has authorized and will open bids on late this month.

The course of these planes along the lake shore from Milwaukee to Chicago would take them directly over this section and before long the big navy planes may become a common daily sight.
