### COUNTY BOY SCOUT COUNCIL PLANNED

Meeting Held at Waukegan on Tuesday, and North Shore Well Represented

A meeting was held last Tuesday night in Waukegan, for the purpose of forming a Lake County Boy Scout Council. In addition to representatives of the two organized councils, Waukegan-North Chicago, and the North Shore council of Highland Park, Deerfield, Highwood, Fort Sheridan and Ravinia, there were representatives of the following towns: Antioch, Lake Zurich, Lake Forest, Lake Bluff, Libertyville, Gurnee and Zion.

The Waukegan-North Chicago council has done the pioneer work in laying out the plans for a county council, maps showing the logical Scout districts and division of territory in the county. Due to the amount of pioneer work done by the Waukegan council, they felt justified in calling an organization meeting with representatives of the interested communities above.

Due to the fact that the question of a Lake County council has not been formally presented to the Scout council of the Highland Park district, its representatives were unable to say that the North Shore council was definitely in favor of a county organization. However, the opinion seemed to be that they would more highly favor the plan of Regional Headquarters—that is, organization of the north shore communities into a North Shore council separate from the Lake County organization. This would, of course, call for team work on the part of the towns from Lake Bluff south to Winnetka. The opinion of the Lake Forest representatives was that they were inclined to favor the North Shore project.

The North Shore council representatives and the delegates from Lake Forest agreed with Mr. F. D. Chadwick, the deputy regional Scout executive who is in charge of the expansion program along the north shore that more real good could be done for scouting in this district through the organization of the communities along the north shore from Winnetka to Lake Bluff, inclusive, than could be done through the organization of a strictly Lake County council.

The meeting adjourned without definitely forming a county organization. The question of a North Shore or a Lake county council will be put up to the North Shore council at its next meeting in January. Lake Forest is waiting for their decision before agreeing to enter the county organization. Whatever action the North Shore council takes in the matter will be based only on the thing that will assure the greatest good for scouting along the north shore, and the best method of reaching those communities lying back from the lake shore who are not at present receiving the benefit of organized scouting.

### AUTO OWNERS WANT NEW LICENSE NOS.

Half of the automobile owners in Illinois apparently want a low state license number for their automobile in 1926. Secretary of State Louis L. Emmerson is being bombarded with letters from every section of the state requesting license plates of four figures or less.

One hopeful correspondent asked for number 1 and another wanted a one-figure number if he could get it and if not he was willing to accept Mr. Emmerson's own number, 17.

"Under the law, if a man applies for his license before December 1 he has a right to hold the same number," Mr. Emmerson said today. Practically all of the holders of low numbers are retaining them under this provision of the law. That leaves very few low numbers and we have twice as many requests this year as ever before.

"Those who have secured low numbers in the past are asking for lower numbers. In cases where there have been deaths or removal from the state of holders of low numbers, almost invariably some friend or relative has written in requesting the assignment of the number. Usually there are scores of requests for each number made available in this way."

"It would be fine if we could accommodate all who make requests, but it just can't be done. The numerical system does not provide enough numbers under 10,000 to take care of even a small portion of the requests."

interest. "The Song of the Lark" sketches the life in the rear area way of a big city apartment, and gives a glimpse of the hard working wife of a lazy janitor, harassed by the tenants and the union boss. One of life's burden bearers, simple, uncomplaining, yet sensitive to beauty and driven to sudden daring when the caged bird of one of the tenants struggles for freedom. It was a wistful bit beautifully done by Mrs. Ewell, who designed the setting which was remarkable in its cleverness for giving a sense of space and of the city of high, massive apartment buildings seen in the distance, all accomplished upon a small stage, 14 by 16 feet in size. This play is a bit of drama from real life. The janitor's wife, Hannah, who in real life lives in Chicago, was in the audience. Mrs. Ewell, as Hannah, was well supported by a cast which included Mrs. Frank Horn, Mrs. Kenneth Bennett, Mrs. David Clarke, Marie Trevisan, who quite captured the audience with her characterization of a spit fire Neuhut, Earl Gibbs and Charlotte Robertson.

"The Skeleton in the Closet" thoroughly modern in text, was concerned with a woman and her career. Children and cooking, or art? The Venys' are artists, Mrs. Venys, the better of the two. But unfortunately a big contrast for morals depends upon the decision of a hard-bolled business man, who believes that woman's place is the home. So the design, most of the work by the wife is submitted in the husband's name. The man of business, impersonated by Harry Barackman, invites himself and his wife to dinner at the studio to get acquainted and make the decision. The cook hired for the occasion fails them and the artist's wife cannot cook.

Helen Jones and Fred Cozad playing the distraught artists, presented a convincing picture of studio life with its soaring ambitions and heart breaking disappointments. Members of the cast supporting the leads were Mrs. Roy Browning, cleverly impersonating the Irish cook that failed, Mrs. W. H. Mast, Mrs. Mary Hoffman, Robert Jerome and Helen Clason.

The last play, "The Millennium," a drama of much character and beauty, was principally the work of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Peyraud. Mr. Peyraud, a noted artist, for some years designed scenery for some of the largest New York theaters. Our community has been honored by his generous contribution to the success of the production.
