**NAMES SUGGESTED
FOR NEW STATIONS**
VARIETY IN TITLES SEEN

Some of Those Suggested by
Contestants in Skokie Valley
Line Competition Are
Here Given

What's in a name?
"Not much," some persons will say.
"It's what's back of the name that
counts."

That is true to a large extent. But
the five prominent persons acting as
judges in the \$1,000 Award Contest,
conducted by the Chicago North Shore
and Milwaukee railroad (The North
Shore Line) to select names for the
nine stations along the new Skokie
Valley Route, have a different view
of the matter.

When the contest closed on Decem-
ber 1, these judges were confronted
with the gigantic task of going
through approximately 75,000 sugges-
tions to secure the nine most appro-
priate names for the new stations.
That, in itself, would impress one with
the fact that names in themselves are
quite an item.

Artistic Suggestions
Perusal of these myriad sugges-
tions discloses many interesting per-
sonal characteristics. For instance,
many indicate an artistic tempera-
ment by suggesting poetic names
such as Fawncrest, Wildwood, Swal-
lowflight, Melodymoor, Garden Vale,
Tanglewood, and Idlehurst.

Then there are the persons clever
at coining names by combining por-
tions of two or more words. Among
such suggestions are Linsota, Glen-
sylvania, Silvamaze, Beatusilvan, Niles-
dale, Skokievale, Sylvania, Willow-
netka, Vistaria and Skovall.

The emotional trait is portrayed in
such names as Hope, Joy, and Free-
dom, while an irrepressible tendency
to be humorous might be considered
disclosed by suggestions of Welcome,
Dropin, 1926 and By-the-Way as ap-
propriate names for stations on a
high-speed electric railroad.

Names of Famous Men
Names of famous men, past and
present, can always be counted on to
figure in such a contest. Among the
thousands appearing in the North
Shore Line contest list are Coolidge,
Lincoln, Harding, Steinmetz, Taft and
Bryan. Chicago contributes through
such prominent names as Dawen,
Dever, Hurley and Thompson. Yes,
and even the name Volstead was sug-
gested!

Another group always certain to be
included in a name contest is that
comprising well-known cities and
places the world over. In this list
are Versailles, Pekin, Delhi, Edin-
burgh, Locarno, Lausanne, Luxem-
bourg, Picardy, Warsaw, Acropolis,
and Killarney. Even the Bible is called
upon, for Gaza, Lebanon and Eden
are listed.

Words purely foreign include El
Paran, El Dorado, Estatos and Hiraah.
The literary tendency asserts itself
with Lady Teazel, Hiawatha and An-
nie Laurie along with many others.

Descriptive Note
The descriptive note is struck by
many to identify the station site with
the surrounding territory. Pine Glen,
Cedar Forest, Elmwood Park, Fern
Hill, Poplar Lane, Goldencrest, Tim-
berleigh and Cedarville are among the
many names of this nature submitted.
The word "elm" figures more times
than any other in this group.

The new Skokie Valley Route serves
a territory abounding in golf courses.
Hence it is only natural that this in-
creasingly popular sport should find
its way into names suggested. It does,
in Golf Glen, Glenfore, Fore, Golfton,
Golfville, Fairway, Foursome, Tee-
land, Brassie Lane, Norgolf and
countless more.

Indians once roamed through the
beautiful North Shore area where
now new ribbons of steel replace the
early pathways through the forests.
Many recalled this fact, and as a re-
sult the list includes among other
names of Indian tribes Iroquois,
Blackfeet, Huron and Seminole.

Will Take Time
To enumerate all classes and vari-
eties of names included in the lengthy
lists now before the judges would re-
quire unlimited space. Likewise, for
the judges to give all these 75,000
suggestions a fair consideration, con-
siderable time is needed. However,
every name has been tabulated and
not one will be overlooked in the
search for the nine most suitable to
become permanently placed on the
map.

"It is a process of elimination," said
one of the judges. "We cannot—and
would not—attempt to select nine
names from among these 75,000 at
one sitting or with only one perusal
of the lists. So we will start out by
selecting all those worthy of consid-
eration, and then continue to elimi-
nate the less suitable until only nine
names are left. It will be the sur-
vival of the fittest in the end."

Indications now are that the selec-
tion of the winning names will not
be completed in time to announce the
awards on December 15, according to
the judges. However, every effort
will be made to finish the big task
without further delay than is neces-
sary to insure fairness to all partic-
ipants. Immediately on final selec-
tions, checks for \$100 each will be
mailed to those submitting the names
chosen, and a like amount to the per-
son submitting the name regarded as
the best among the 75,000 suggestions
on file.
