PURSUIT OF MONEY KILLS SPONTANEITY

NOTED ART EXPERT SAYS

Declares Worship of Mammon Is Responsible for Lack of Naturalness; Youth Is Trudging in Dust

Worship of money in America, our love of competition, our constant striving for material success—all due to "herd suggestion"—dissuade most Americans at the outset from even trying to be natural and spontaneous. In the second lecture of the Harris foundation series at Northwestern university, Professor Daniel Gregory Mason of Columbia university, famous exponent of music and the arts, last Friday night, speaking on "Spontaneity," laid at Mammon's door the responsibility for curtailment of genius, not only in the United States but throughout the world.

Trudge in Dust

"We see all about us young men who might be enriching themselves by the disinterestedness, the passion for quality, and the universal sympathy of the artist, violating their natures in servitude to a narrow, hard, and often bitter professionalism," the speaker said. "Instead of trying to see and express beauty, which can only be done in leisure and self-forgetfulness, they have sharpened themselves to a point in order to 'get on' in order to 'beat the other fellow.' Instead of going out to grass in the wide pastures of the world, they have put on blinders, become hacks, and trudge along dully in the dust of the high-road to success."

"They allow themselves no fructifying leisure, no enriching day-dreams, no casual irresponsible contracts. When they go among people they see only those who may be of use to their 'careers,' and these only on the side of worldly power, usually their least human aspect. And then they wonder why their art is thin, inhuman, jaded and dull."

Most of Them Fail

"Most of them, of course, fail to reach even the goal so unwisely chosen; they exchange the happiness of the unknown but spontaneous worker for the disillusion of the middle-aged time-server who is not only obscure but also cynical and embittered. But what of the few who 'arrive'? Their plight is even more ignominious and tragic, in the measure that their abilities were greater. For since worldly success puts the emphasis all on feverish activity rather than on a rich and loving passivity, artists who

DRY ENFORCEMENT BEFORE CONGRESS

Bitter Fight Predicted in the House at Session Opening This Week

Dry enforcement will be one of the issues raised in the next congress. The opponents of this statute are preparing to wage a bitter fight on the tax on beverages in the new revenue bill. The recent action of certain dry assemblies making suggestions that the President would be a party to the nullification of the prohibition amendment has received a telling blow. The Presidential spokesman discloses the fact that the President is in favor of the prosecution of all violators of the law, no matter whether they are big or little violators. He feels however, that the greater effort should be made against the big men in the illicit liquor industry, because they are the ones who control the supply. It was pointed out that the Department of Justice, with its very limited force, is doing all it can to enforce the law and punish the violators. Many supporters of the enforcement resent and condemn most forcefully some of the sarcastic utterances used recently at Chicago and New York by some of the leaders of the "drys."

Those opposed to the enforcement law claim that there has been a change of sentiment regarding the "dry" amendment, and when the revenue bill is taken up they will have an opportunity to present their side of the case.

The leaders of the "drys" are fully awake to the fact that a real fight will be carried on at the coming session of congress. Some of them are threatening to try and force through a measure that would result in the forfeiture of all private supplies of liquor in this country, supplies that were secured before prohibition became effective. They also are debating if methods cannot be employed which will compel enforcement of that section of the Volstead law which makes it just as illegal to buy liquor as to sell it.

The fight promises to be a most bitter one.
