HOLD THREE SOLDIERS FOR THEFT OF AUTO

Trio Charged With Stealing Maj. Landis Ford Sedan, Sent to County Jail

Three Ft. Sheridan soldiers charged with stealing an auto belonging to Major Reed Landis of Deerfield, were bound over to the grand jury Saturday by Justice A. E. Smith of Highland Park. Their bonds were fixed at \$3,000 each but they went to jail in default.

Chief Ed. Moroney took them to the county jail. The men gave their names and addresses as Anthony Imbo, 25, Brooklyn; Curtis Donley, 21, Humbolt, Ill.; La Verne La Roche, 21, St. Anne, Ill.

They waived hearing at the trial and were bound over without testimony being taken.

The theft of a car, a Ford sedan, took place December 16 and ended with the machine hitting a post.

MUCH HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE BUILDING

County Has Considerable Work Under Way or Planned for Next Spring

Although construction work has been hampered by early snowfalls and winter weather, many improvements are being made in the highways of the county, it was stated this week at the office of Charles E. Russell, county superintendent of highways, according to reports from Waukegan.

Four bridges are included in the improvement program. One bridge in the Fox lake district, known as the Hollister bridge, and located east of Fox Lake, has been completed. This work was carried to completion in spite of great difficulties brought about through the nature of the unstable foundation. The workmen struck quick sand and had to go to a depth of 50 feet before coming to a solid foundation.

The other bridge in that district, which is located on Squaw creek, will be ready by the middle of January.

The Porter bridge, in the township of Cuba, will be completed inside of a month. The contractor is hoping for good weather in order to wind up the job before the middle of the winter. This span is located just west of Barrington in the extreme southwestern tip of the county.

A fourth bridge will be built at Antioch, west of Channel lake, and will span the drainage canal. Work on it will start directly after the holidays.

Besides the bridge construction, the county highway office is superintending the grading of much road in the Fox lake territory. Fox lake resorts have been marooned from the rest of the world in the early spring on account of muddy roads and have lost much business on that account. A series of appeals and petitions to the board of supervisors early this year resulted in action being taken to improve the roads.

On account of the many sink holes and quicksand traps, the work of grading and filling in has been unusually hard. Several miles of road are included in the stretch to be improved.

PLAN PARK DISTRICT IN WEST DEERFIELD

Petition Is Filed in the County Court for Election to Be Held January 12

Another park district for Lake county loomed as a probability with the filing of a petition in the county court of Judge Perry L. Persons, on Monday, for the purpose of calling an election on the proposition. The territory included in the proposed park district is in the town of West Deerfield, and is not included in that of any other park district.

The petition, which was filed by Attorney Martin C. Decker, was signed by over 100 property owners. It called for the election on Tuesday, January 12, in the town hall at Deerfield, between the hours of 7 a. m. and 5 p. m.

The judges of the election will be William F. Plagge, John Stryker, and Ira Holz. The clerks will be Julia Peterson, Vida Jacobson and Bessie Anderson.

NAME COMMITTEE ON FAIR GROUNDS

A committee of six men was formed Saturday afternoon at a meeting of the Lake County Fair association at the Farm Bureau office in Libertyville, to investigate the future of the fair grounds.
