THAT THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE
VILLAGE OF DEERFIELD, LAKE COUNTY,
ILLINOIS, MAY BE AMENDED AS FOLLOWS:
That the last paragraph of Section 3 of said
Ordinance may be amended so as to
read as follows:

Intensity of Use of Lots: No build-
ing with its accessory building shall
occupy in excess of thirty per cent
(30%) of the area of an interior lot,
nor in excess of thirty-five per cent
(35%) of the area of a corner lot.
No dwelling or group of dwellings
shall hereafter be erected or altered
to accommodate or make provision
for more than four (4) families on
any acre of land, nor make provision
for more than a proportional
number of families on any fractional
part of an acre of land, except that
a single family dwelling may be
erected on any lot having an area
of less than one-fourth of an acre,
provided that such lot shall have been
duly recorded prior to the passage of
this ordinance.

All persons interested are hereby
notified that a hearing on said pro-
posed amendment will be had by the
Board of Appeals of said Village on
the 25th day of January, A. D. 1926,
at the hour of eight o'clock P. M. at
the Masonic Hall in the Village of
Deerfield, Lake County, Illinois, at

said proposed amendment if they see
fit so to do, or may file written pro-
test against said proposed amend-

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REFUSE SENATE SEAT
TO N. D. APPOINTEE
Find Governor Did Not Have
Legal Right to Make
Appointment
The majority report of the Senate
Election committee has found Govern-
or A. G. Sorlie of North Dakota did
not have the legal power to appoint
a United States senator. It will thus
be seen that the vote of the commit-
tee in denying Mr. Gerald P. Nye a
seat in the senate was non-partisan
and based solely upon legal grounds.
This action on the part of the commit-
tee was decided upon because of the
legal phases of the question. The vote
was nine to two against Nye. The
only members of the committee voting
to seat Nye were Smith, Democrat of
South Carolina and Neely, Democrat
of West Virginia, while those oppos-
ing the designate were Senators Ernst
of Kentucky, Watson of Indiana,
Sherridge of California, Greene of
Vermont, Deneen of Illinois, and Goff
of West Virginia, Republicans. In
their contention they were supported
by Senators King of Utah, George of
Georgia, and Stephens of Mississippi,
Democrats.
