

ZION ANNOUNCER'S COTTAGE IS BURNED

Summer Home of J. H. Depew Is Total Loss Saturday; Incendiary, Belief

Zion police would like to find trace of a mysterious wanderer of the lake front, seen with a torch in his hand just before the summer cottages of Jasper H. Depew and Earl Lee were burned to the ground early Saturday.

Mr. Depew, the chief announcer of radio station WCBD, lost a cottage three years ago this winter, and police at that time thought that it had been burned by an incendiary.

Both cottages were burned to the ground, although the fire department made a record run of almost two miles, and saved two other cottages in the path of the flames. In addition the department salvaged the bulk of the Lee furniture.

The alarm was turned in at 6:30 o'clock in the morning. The person who turned in the alarm thought that it was an unusually bright sunrise, finally discovering that it was a fire.

At 5:40 o'clock, about an hour earlier, Charles Fulton, a farmer, noticed a man walking along the beach. He had a torch or a lantern in his hand. Shortly afterward he noticed the fire.

WAUKEGAN MINISTER WANTS TO RESIGN

Dr. Chidester Surprises Congregation Sunday; Pastor For Thirty-Two Years

Rev. Samuel W. Chidester, D. D., popular pastor of the First Presbyterian church of Waukegan for the last thirty-two years, formally tendered his resignation to the congregation of his church last Sunday at the morning service. He urged that the resignation be accepted immediately. His action was quite unexpected.

Dr. Chidester pointed out that his advancing years has caused a growing desire on his part to be allowed to retire and to be free from all the duties and responsibilities of his position.

Seven years ago, at the expiration of a pastorate of 2 years, Dr. Chidester tendered his resignation. There was a general protest from every member of the church and the pastor finally was prevailed upon to continue his duties.

RADER PLANS TEMPLE BUILT AT WAUCONDA

Rehabilitation of Defunct Railroad Also Is Planned, Says This Report

A \$500,000 temple project for Wauconda, the refinancing of the Chicago, Palatine and Wauconda railroads, and a sweeping operation in summer cottage real estate for the vicinity of Wauconda and including the farm lands adjoining Lake Zurich, Round Lake, Grayslake and other points in the western part of Lake county was announced recently from the Paul Rader headquarters in Chicago.

The railroad, which ceased operation some time ago, runs northwest from Palatine, through Lake Zurich to Wauconda. Financial rehabilitation, which is now in process, will be followed by physical rehabilitation, and a branch line will be constructed to the tabernacle, according to a statement by Dr. Rader from Los Angeles.

The tabernacle over which Dr. Rader will preside, will be started as soon as frost is out of the ground, and it is expected to be completed in time for summer services. Dr. Rader held revival meetings on the same site last summer, using a circus tent and transporting the congregation in motor busses.
