

CLEAN SCREENS IN CAR'S GAS SYSTEM

Slight Particle of Dirt May Be Cause of Frequent Motoring Troubles

In the gasoline system of the car there are usually three strainers; one at the gasoline supply tank, one at the entrance to the vacuum tank and another at the entrance to the carburetor. Each of these should, according to the mechanical first aid department of the Chicago Motor club, have an occasional inspection. They H. S. The opening of the carburetor jets are often very small holes, carefully gauged by the manufacturer to provide the proper fuel mixture.
