STEPHEN HOPKINS OF REVOLUTIONARY DAYS

One of Signers of Declaration of Independence Noted for Famous Epigram

Many a man's place in history is founded upon a sentence in which he struck the current nail on the head. "Don't fire until you see the whites of their eyes," "Give me liberty or give me death," and "I have not yet begun to fight," have proved the touchstones of undying fame for their authors.

Among the signers of the Declaration of Independence, the one hundred and fiftieth anniversary of which will be commemorated by the Sesqui-Centennial International Exposition in Philadelphia this year, was Stephen Hopkins, of Rhode Island, whose remark upon appending his signature to the historic document deserves more fame than it has won. "Sir, your hand trembles," challenged a bystander, as Hopkins, with unsteady hand, took up the pen to sign the Declaration.

"True, sir, but my heart does not," was the reply. He was nearly seventy years of age, but his answer made no apology for physical disability. That his spirit was indomitable in spite of obstacles is evidenced in the accounts of his life. He was self-taught, but in time came to be Chancellor of Brown University. He was bred a farmer, but served as Governor of Rhode Island for a number of terms. He did not find public life incompatible with study. He left the farm to engage in mercantile business and surveying, the first steps in a career which was to lead him into Colonial prominence.

Being advanced in years during the stirring times of 1775-7, he was able to give to affairs of the Colonies the accumulated wisdom of a man who had passed through strenuous political history. He was a clear and convincing speaker, and used his influence in favor of decisive measures. He was a member of the committee which drafted the Articles of Confederation.

Hopkins's first public office was that of Justice of the Peace. He later was a member of the Rhode Island Legislature, Speaker of the Assembly, Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, a delegate to the Colonial Convention at Albany in 1754, one of the committee which drew up a plan of union, and, finally, a member of the First Continental Congress.

CLEAN SCREENS IN CAR'S GAS SYSTEM
Slight Particle of Dirt May Be Cause of Frequent Motor-ing Troubles
In the gasoline system of the car there are usually three strainers; one at the gasoline supply tank, one at the entrance to the vacuum tank and another at the entrance to the carburetor. Each of these should, according to the mechanical first aid department of the Chicago Motor club, have an occasional inspection. They may become badly clogged and restrict the amount of fuel which feeds to the carburetor.

The opening of the carburetor jets are often very small holes, carefully gauged by the manufacturer to provide the proper fuel mixture. If jets become clogged by a particle of dirt, engine operation will be erratic. Jets are usually removable, being screwed into the bottom of the carburetor, and are therefore easy to remove for inspection or cleaning. A metal wire should never be used to clean the openings of a carburetor jet; the jet opening may be enlarged and this will disturb the action of the carburetor. A broom straw is usually stiff enough to clean the jet opening and will not damage the finely gauged hole.

The carburetor as well as the vacuum tank is usually provided with a drain cock at the bottom. This allows any water to be drained off from time to time. The water, being heavier than the fuel, is always found at the lowest points. Water in the carburetor may cause spitting and missing, particularly at high speed.

EMPLOYMENT IN U. S. RAPIDLY INCREASING
Employment in the United States is increasing steadily. Most notable is the increased activity of the agricultural implement industry, showing a gain in employment of eight per cent. In all the industries surveyed, eighteen of the twenty-five showed gains in employment. Average weekly earnings were 116 per cent greater than in July, 1914. Real wages, that is, the amount of goods the present dollar will buy as compared with the dollar of 1914, were 26 per cent higher in November, 1925, than in 1914.
