**CELLIST AND SINGER
GIVE FINE PROGRAM**

ELM PLACE AUDITORIUM

Representative Audience Hears
Hans Hess and Helen Freund
Sunday; Auspices Woman's
Civic Club

A superb program was given last Sunday by Hans Hess, the noted cellist and Helen Freund, coloratura soprano of the Chicago Civic Opera company before the largest audience gathered at the Elm Place auditorium in Highland Park this season. Through a blinding snow storm, over ice covered streets and buffeted by a vicious wind and penetrating cold, a representative audience of Milwaukee's and of Chicago's North Shore elite braved the elements to hear these artists and they were well repaid for their efforts.

A noble performance, rich in coloring, new in thought and perfect in execution may truly describe the superb playing of Mr. Hess. At no time has this renowned virtuoso exhibited a greater skill, a more pronounced nobility of tonal quality, a more astonishing technique. His playing at times actually stunned his audience with its brilliancy and again made them lose all sense of reality by the purity and ethereal character of the quieter and more subdued passages. A new conception of execution was apparent throughout, the performance, a new appreciation, as it were, of the great possibility of the cello as an instrument of contemporary music. One lost all sense of the material and it was the actual spirit of music personified that dominated. Not the artist, not the vehicle of expression, but the living spirit of the original inspiration itself. The music that first inspired the composer to create, even before it was given to the world as a manuscript.

Brilliant Interpretation

Mr. Hess opened the program with a brilliant interpretation of a sonata of the 17th century by G. Sammartini, after which, continued applause brought forth the exquisite "Melodie" by Gluck as encore. Mr. Hess's second group opened with the poetic "Nocturne" by Chopin, followed by a "Tarantelle" by Joral, again showing Mr. Hess's amazing skillful bow technique. "el Angelus Senna," a modern composition by Charles Lagourgue and dedicated to Mr. Hess, followed, making a pleasing contrast in the program, and this interesting group ended with a delightful rendering of the fairy-like tones of Popper's "Efin Tanz" played in a sparkling and vivacious mood. A fitting climax to this program was a marvelous rendering of Boellmann's masterpiece for the cello "Variations Symphonique." Mr. Hess generously added several encores to his share of the program. Miss Juul Rosine, furnished Mr. Hess perfect accompaniments at the piano.

Soprano Scores Hit

Miss Helen Freund, prima donna soprano of the Chicago Civic Opera company shared the program with Mr. Hess. Miss Freund who sang in Ravinia last summer, received a most cordial welcome, and scored a hit with the North Shore music loving audience even greater than that achieved recently in her concert at the Winter club in Lake Forest. Her lovely voice and charming personality added greatly to the success of the concert and brought her repeated and enthusiastic applause from her audience. She also was called upon for extras at the end of each of her two groups of songs. In the second group she included one of Mr. Herman Devries' compositions. Her accompanist was Mme. Herman Devries, her distinguished teacher.

The success of this concert is but another achievement of the Woman's Civic Club of Ravinia and much credit is due the arts committee under the direction of Mrs. Frank C. Peyraud, who personally gave so much of her time and energy to further the success of this enterprise.
