

**NEW TRIER WINNER
IN DIST. TOURNEY**

**Defeats Evanston In Finals,
After Beating Deerfield
Earlier In the Meet**

New trier high school won the district championship of the high school tournament at Evanston Saturday night, beating Evanston high in the final game, 24 to 14. The north shore team, one of the strongest fives in the state, by its victory qualified for the section tournament at Joliet next Friday and Saturday.

Elgin, state champion for the past two years, is among those to survive the initial round. Other winners in the several district tourneys are:

Deerfield-Shields was defeated early in the tournament by New Trier, 21 to 13, but the score does not show how close the game really was. With Dickinson starring at center and doing most of the offensive work and Stipe holding down the score, New Trier was given a mighty stiff scare. They were greatly outplayed during the entire first half.

At the beginning of the second half the New Trier boys came back and opened a very good offensive attack, but Deerfield was still holding them down at the end of the third quarter with a score of 15-13 in favor of New Trier.

The fourth quarter brought forth many fouls on the part of Deerfield and New Trier took advantage to win out 21-13 on the fastest and best game New Trier played during the whole tournament.

**MORE NORTHWESTERN
TRAINS STOP HERE**

The new trains are:
No. 339, leaving Chicago at 10:05 a. m., arriving at Highland Park at 10:50.

Southbound train No. 388 will leave Highland Park at 11:56 a. m. arriving in Chicago at 12:45 p. m.

These trains fill in two bad gaps. The latter train especially was requested to meet the requirements of Highland Park people who wanted to lunch in the city prior to other engagements.

The Chicago & North Western railway company has during the past few months made a marked improvement in the service and they express the hope the new trains may carry sufficient passengers to warrant the additional expense.

In diving Osborne failed to qualify by two points, a diver from Harrison nosing him out.

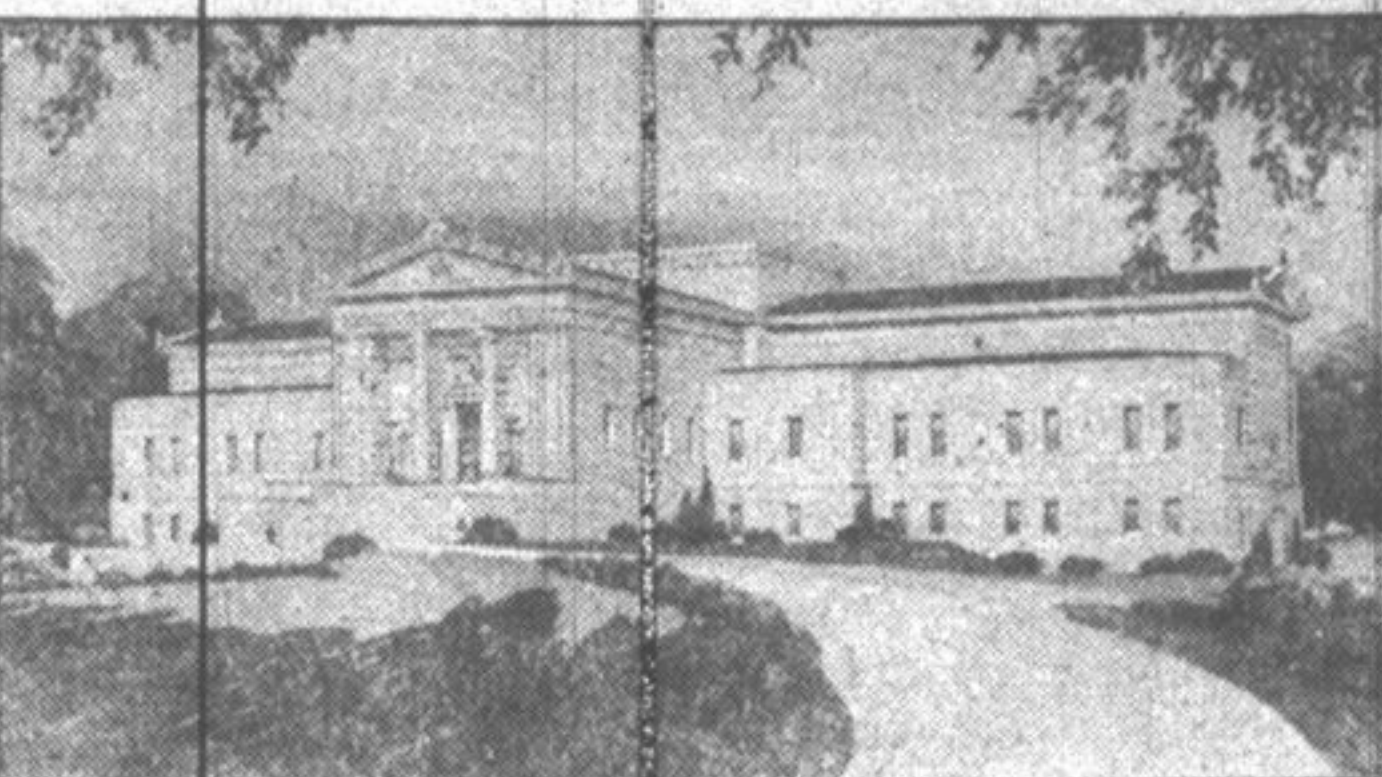
Deerfield's two plungers, Anderson and O'Neill were off form and failed to qualify.

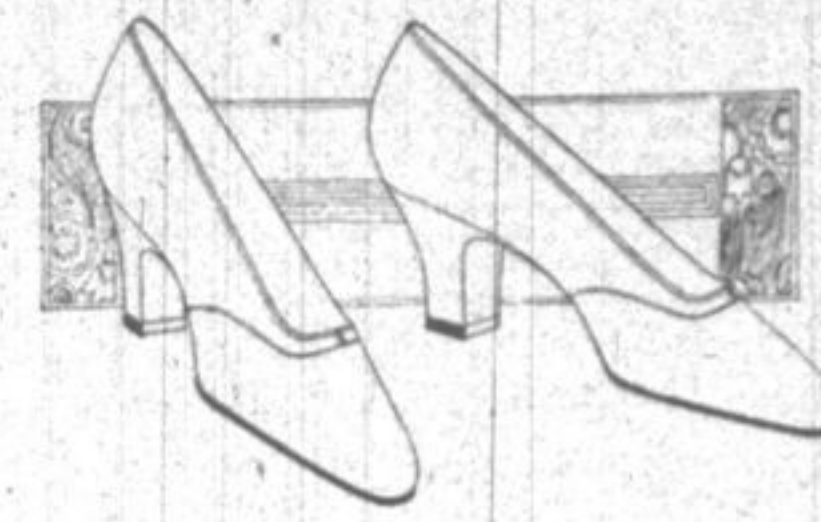
