

INFANT WELFARE HAS GOOD ANNUAL REPORT

Last Year Best in History of Organization According to This Statement

The year 1925 was the best one in the history of the Infant Welfare society of Chicago, according to its annual report. This is true both with respect to the number of babies, children and mothers cared for and results obtained as well as support received for the society, it is said.

There were 12,847 babies under two years of age cared for, an increase of not quite 10 per cent over 1924; 2,193 children from 2 to 6 years of age, an increase of nearly 15 per cent; and 1,296 expectant mothers which was an increase of almost 25 per cent. This makes a total of babies, children and mothers cared for during 1925 of 16,336 which is 1,645 more than during January 1924, or an increase for all of over 11 per cent.

The total amount of money expended in giving care to these 16,336 was \$145,065.89 for the year. This is an increase of \$4,000 over the expenses for 1924 which is less than 3 per cent. In other words the Infant Welfare society gave its care to over 11 per cent more babies, children and expectant mothers with less than 3 per cent more cost.

The public gave the Infant Welfare society the best support last year that it has ever received. The total income for the year was \$146,875.89, which represents an increase in income over 1924 of about 9 per cent. This makes an excess of income over expenses of \$1,809.50.

Special credit is due the various centers of the Woman's Auxiliary, including those in New Trier, for the increased support received. Early in 1925 the Finance committee of the Auxiliary with the Finance committee of the board of directors of the society worked out a new schedule of station costs based on the 1925 budget.
