

"PAIR O' FOOLS" OPENS CHICAGO ENGAGEMENT

Kolb & Dill Appear in Musical Comedy at Studebaker Theatre; Opened Sunday

Kolb and Dill, who opened at the Studebaker Theatre on Sunday evening, March 21, in their riotous musical comedy, "Pair O' Fools," are not unknown to Chicagoans.

They have played in this city four times, their most notable successes being "Lonesome Town" and "The High Cost of Loving," the latter attraction having had a successful run here nearly a decade ago.

"Pair O' Fools," book by John Emerson and Anita Loos, the lyrics and music by Byron Gay, is regarded by theatre-goers and critics as the most notable success of Kolb and Dill. The show hardly had opened on the Pacific coast, its point of origin, before requests for bookings were received from numerous eastern states.

"Pair O' Fools" is unlike the usual musical comedy inasmuch as it is not plotless, but carries a distinct story which is dotted with ludicrous situations and laughable lines. The music by Byron Gay, under the direction of Jerome Stewartson, is notable for its brilliance and tunefulness.

The "California Sweet Sixteen" dancing girls, an aggregation of beauties from the Pacific coast, not one of whom is more than twenty years of age, have become the sensation of the west. Described as possessors of unlimited beauty, these misses present numerous novelties in toe dancing as well as a clever routine of intricate steps. George Cunningham, who produced the dances for "Pair O' Fools," regards the "California Sweet Sixteen" as the most talented chorus that has ever come under his observation.

NEW BOOKS IN DEMAND AT PUBLIC LIBRARY

"Twenty-five Years," "The Small House Primer" Among List at Local Institution

Most in demand, perhaps, among the new books at the Public Library is Lord Grey's "Twenty-five Years," an extraordinary account of the crisis of 1914 written by a statesman who was long and intimately connected with British foreign affairs. It is a work which can hardly fail to influence public opinion throughout the world.

Supplementing, in a way, Lord Grey's memoirs, are the volume "Intimate Papers of Colonel House," arranged by Charles Seymour. These volumes are full of astonishing revelations, including conversations with kings and kaisers and such momentous correspondence with the leading statesmen of Europe and America as probably no private citizen in the history of the world ever before carried on.

"The Small House Primer" by Edwin Bonta gives an opportunity to satisfy that hidden impulse to at least plan on paper, if not to build, a home. This is a practical book in which plans and proportions, exterior and interior details, ornament and coloring, and the fittings of one's house to one's desires, environments, and purse, are all discussed.

The small book "Hooked Rugs and How to Make Them" by Mrs. A. M. Phillips not only describes various hand-made rugs and how to make them, but also makes a plea for the revival of this neglected household art. The author urges the rug-maker to eschew patterns and machines and to learn the thrill that comes from designing and executing one's own rug designs.

The great tower of Senlis, Gerber-viller's historic hall, and the keep of Cony-le-Chateau are among the vanished splendors that live again under the pen and pencil of Mr. George E. Wharton's "Vanished Halls and Cathedrals of France," a new edition of which has just been added to the Public Library. This American artist describes and pictures the vanished glories of Reims, Noyon, Arras, Verdun, St. Quentin, and many other towns of which we heard so much during the war.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES ON BUSINESS BASIS

To insure sound business methods and safeguard the financial integrity of student activities at Miami University, Oxford, Ohio, all financial officers of such activities are under supervision and their books are audited at regular intervals by the university authorities. The student activities, including fraternities and sororities, number about 90 and disburse more than \$184,000 annually. A uniform system of bookkeeping has been adopted and adapted to the several organizations. Budgets for the year are prepared in advance and must be strictly observed.

INDUSTRY BEARING EDUCATION COSTS

Universities and "other training schools" in the Province of Quebec will benefit by a contemplated increase in the royalty charged upon hydroelectric horsepower under leases granted by the Province. The provincial government proposes practically to double the rates. It is explained that expected great industrial growth in the Province will be followed by greater demands upon educational institutions, and that this industry should bear the additional cost of such education, according to a report by Albert Halstead, American Consul General, Montreal.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR EDUCATION NUMEROUS

Many Courses Open for Students in London Institutions; Are Varied

Thirteen thousand classes in 250 day and evening institutions are available to students in London, England, who wish to continue their education beyond the elementary grades. Students who enroll immediately upon leaving elementary schools are admitted free to junior evening institutes. Through scholarships industrial young people may continue their work in research and degree courses in some of the best-equipped technical and evening instruction costs approximately \$1,250,000, only one-fifth of which is paid by student fees.

NEAR EAST WORK BY AMERICA MOUNTING

U. S. Has Spent Ninety-Five Millions in Relief Work, Report Says

The United States has spent \$95,000,000 in near east relief work, according to reports filed with the League of Nations here.

Of this sum, \$25,000,000 has been spent in Armenia; \$20,000,000 in Turkey, \$12,000,000 in Syria and Palestine, \$8,000,000 in Mesopotamia and Persia, and \$4,000,000 in Greece.

Last year the amount spent was \$42,919,000, most of which was devoted to orphanage and child welfare work, reaching nearly 750,000 persons.

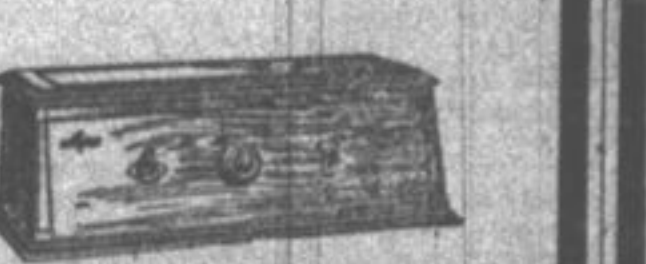

This is a two story high attic and basement house of stucco and frame, better class, modern construction; birch trim throughout excepting the dining room which is fumed oak. The first floor consists of a living room, the full breadth of the house, 34x19—dining room 18 x 14—kitchen 14 x 12 and built-in cabinets—two fine rooms 16 x 16 usable as chambers,—which are entered from two private center halls, as is the tile bath and several clothes closets other than those in the rooms themselves.

The second floor contains a living room 16 x 18, and three master chambers. There are immense closets and a bath. A large, comfortable, roomy home.

The house is heated by American Ideal hot water system, with hot water connections for winter use; a gas heater for summer hot water. The basement contains fruit closet, coal and furnace rooms, abundant store and work rooms, large, airy, light laundry; toilet, etc.

The grounds are the real beauty of this property, having had 14 years constant cultivation and are natural (not artificial) as far as the birch, oak, hickory and maple trees are concerned.
