Members of Both Senior and Junior Teams Make Good Showing Friday

In the Annual Indoor Suburban League Track meet held last Saturday at Patten gymnasium, Evanston, both Deerfield's junior and senior teams secured several places.

The senior men who placed were Cain, Hammond, Koller, Stipe, Cope, Zengler, Johnson, and Frye. Cain was fourth in the first 440-yard dash, which was run in good time, while Hammond pulled a surprise in coping fourth in the second race against a good field.
