

ANNUAL MEETING OF LAKE SHORE TEACHERS

To Be Held at Oak Park High School April 19; Noted Speakers

The Lake Shore division of the Illinois Teachers' association will meet at Oak Park high school April 19.

Mr. Raymond Robbins will speak during the morning session while Professor William E. Dodd, Professor Philip Fox, editor of the Elementary English Journal, and Mr. D. C. Certain will appear on the afternoon program.

In addition to the regular meetings there will be sectional meetings. Mr. R. W. Schneider and Mr. H. C. Wright of Deerfield-Shields will act as chairman of the Industrial Arts and of the Intermediate and High School sectional meetings respectively.

Music will be furnished by high school organizations. There are in Cook and Lake counties about 2,400 members of the institute. These members are all high school or elementary school teachers.

It is her hope to have further meetings of this group to compare notes on activities, to work as common clearing house, and to see how the high school can help.
