

SAYS BUTTER MOST HEALTHFUL OF FATS STATEMENT BY AN EXPERT

Director of Illinois Agriculture Dept. Declares There Is No Adequate Substitute for This Food

Following is an interesting statement regarding butter, by S. J. Starard, director Illinois Department of Agriculture:

In answer to recent widely published statements which were apparently intended to discourage the use of creamy butter, I desire to call the public's attention to the following facts:

Milk has been nature's most perfect food since prehistoric times. First it was goat's milk and in more recent times, cow's milk. Milk is a complete food, the first received by the infant, and the most beneficial food which we received in life.

Butter is the fat of the milk and is the most healthful and desirable fat consumed by man. Creamery butter is the safest and best butter obtainable. It is manufactured in a most careful and scientific manner. It is thoroughly pasteurized, rendering it perfectly healthful and if consumed while fresh, cannot be excelled as a palatable, reliable and desirable food.

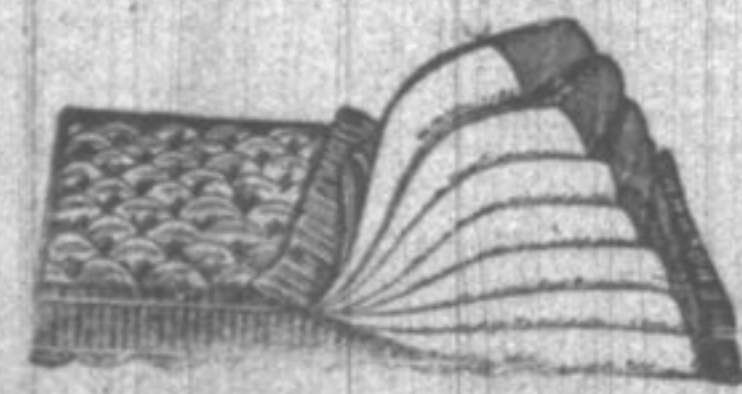
"The Eighteenth amendment is in the constitution. It can be repealed only by another amendment submitted by a two-thirds vote of both branches of congress and ratified by three-fourths of the states. The Volstead act has been upheld by the Supreme court and will stand until repealed by congress.

"No referendum conducted by a newspaper, a group of individuals or an organization can change either the Eighteenth amendment or the Volstead act. Neither does the vote of such a referendum represent the opinions of the community or even the readers of the newspapers. Those who protest against a cause sign such a referendum much more readily than those who want no change.

"There is no way of checking up the age, citizenship or nationality, or even the number of individuals voting, for there may be many repeaters.
