BRIEF NEWS ITEMS FROM LAKE COUNTY

NEIGHBORHOOD JOTTINGS

Interesting Happenings About This Part of North Shore and Vicinity; Doings at County Seat

After five years of service as boys work secretary of the Waukegan Y. M. C. A., Mr. E. B. Davis has resigned to accept a similar position with the Y. M. C. A. at Aurora, Illinois.

Hundreds of members and visitors from other lodges jammed the new club house of the Waukegan Elks lodge at the housewarming held last week. The affair started at seven o'clock and lasted until the wee small hours of the morning.

Members of all posts in the American Legion in Lake county forming the eighth district of this organization will gather at the new U. S. Veterans hospital in North Chicago on Sunday, April 11, to make a tour of inspection of the institution.

John S. Lux, aged 77 years, a resident of Lake county all of his life, died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Wilbur Moore, in Waukegan last week, after a long illness from chronic stomach trouble.

North Chicago's largest business building now completed, the San-kiewicz building at Sheridan road and Foss Park avenue, was sold last week to Attorney J. A. Miller and Joe Meyer of Waukegan.

According to orders from William J. Stratton, head of the state conservation department and candidate for state treasurer, ten million baby lake trout will be dumped into Lake Michigan off the shores of Waukegan.

Thirty-two stayovers slept in the Waukegan city jail one night last week, having sought shelter from the blizzard. The next morning they were offered jobs by the North Shore Line who wanted men to shovel snow from the tracks. Without exception the stayovers politely but firmly declined.

Mrs. Eliza Coulson, aged 77 years, mother of Harvey C. Coulson, Waukegan attorney and justice of the peace, died at her home in Grafton, Wis., one morning last week after ailing illness. Justice Coulson and six other children were at the bedside of their mother when she passed away.

Waukeganites who had been looking forward to a reduction of fifty cents a ton in the price of anthracite coal on April 1 were disappointed, as local coal dealers have received word that the coal operators at Scranton, Pa., have decided not to put the reduction into effect this year. Coal prices, they assert, will remain uniform summer and winter this year.
