AN ORDINANCE

MAKING EMERGENCY APPRO-PRIATION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING MAY 1, 1925 AND ENDING APRIL 30, 1926. WHEREAS, the capacity of the intake pipe at the City Water Plant at the present time under favorable conditions is estimated at four million gallons per day, which capacity under unfavorable conditions may be reduced to a point where the water supply of Highland Park would be

almost, if not entirely, cut off; and WHEREAS, in order to correct the situation it is necessary to purchase and install a low lift pump with necessary motor equipment and to connect the same direct to the existing intake pipe so as to increase the intake capacity of the water works under normal conditions from approximately four million gallons per day to seven million gallons per day, and to purchase and install in con-nection therewith a high lift pump together with necessary motion equipment to increase the present capacity of water to the distribution system, and to insure an adequate supply of water under unfavorable conditions for general use and fire emergency;

WHEREAS, the estimated daily requirements of the City for the spring and early summer are six million gallons per day; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of installation of a high lift pump and a low lift pump with the necessary connections, together with repairs of the present intake pipe, including the chlorinator and engineering services, is approximately Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00); and

WHEREAS, there is no appropriation in the annual appropriation ordinance of the City of Highland Park for the fiscal year beginning May 1, 1925, and ending April 30, 1926, for such expenditure of money; and

WHEREAS, the conditions above recited have arisen since the passage of said annual appropriation bill due to change of weather conditions and the lowering of the level of the water and the settling well at the pumping station, which conditions were unforeseen at the time of the annual da to show the business men what appropriation bill, and which now threaten to diminish and cut off the

water supply of the City; and WHEREAS, the cutting off and diminishing of said water supply for one way to achieve success, and that the City will result in great loss and damage to property, and the spread of contagion and disease; and
