

LATE PROCEEDINGS IN PROBATE COURT

Recent Action in Estates Under Settlement; Orders and Docket Entries

Recent proceedings in Probate court are reported as follows: Otis L. Beardsley, Highland Park—Will admitted to probate. Estate valued at \$60,000 given to wife, Grace L. Beardsley. Letter testamentary issued to Grace L. Beardsley. Bond of \$40,000. Proof of heirship taken.

Archibald W. Fletcher, Highland Park—Petition for sale of real estate under terms of will filed and set for hearing May 3.

Guieseppe Lencioni, Highland Park—Inventory approved.

Ann Caslin, Highland Park—Petition for probate of will filed and set for hearing June 21.

Delavan Smith, Lake Forest—Final report and account approved. Executors discharged and estate closed. All legacies paid in full, about 300 in all, including bequests to employees at Lake Forest and an Indianapolis News; \$5,000 to Lake Forest Presbyterian church, \$100,000 to Lake Forest hospital for a building for a memorial to his mother, and balance of about \$1,000,000 to Indianapolis Foundation for the general charities of the city of Indianapolis—playground, hospitals, libraries, etc.

The total amount of the estate was \$2,385,899.
