## Spring Cleanup

The springtime is the season of housecleaning. Formerly this was practiced only by the ambitious housewife, but now municipal spring cleanups have become quite the thing. The practice is a good one and should be made universal. Nearly every enterprising city and town now has a spring cleanup campaign. The trash and other accumulations of winter are carried away and things are made spick and span for the approaching summer.

Unfortunately, however, in many communities the spring cleanup is confined almost entirely to the residential districts, and the business districts are apt to be neglected. The residential districts of nearly all of our American cities and towns are now beautiful. The average American is either a homeowner or is anxious to become one, and so takes a great deal of pride in his house and its surroundings.

The same pride ought to be exercised in regard to the business districts. A few weeks ago Kansas City, through its real estate board, started a campaign to clean up and renovate the business district. Kansas City is noted the country over as a community of beautiful homes and is now ambitious to have the same thing said about its business district. And in fact there is no reason why the business district of the average city and town should not be as attractive in its way as the residential sections. It would be easier to do more business and better business in more attractive surroundings. And it must be admitted that, with few notable exceptions, our business districts have not kept pace with our residential areas.

Let unselfishness, goodness, mercy, justice, health, holiness, love—the kingdom of heaven—reign within us, and sin, disease, and death will diminish until they finally disappear" (p. 248).
