CHARGED WITH TRYING TO WRECK TRAIN; HELD

A man whose name was reported to be Andy Chrismarik, 22, of Deerfield, was held in the county jail in default of \$5,000 bonds charged with attempting to wreck a train on the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul railroad at 12:40 Monday morning, according to report from Waukegan.

According to railroad detectives, Andy was on the train coming out from Chicago. The brakeman declared that the man was under the influence of liquor and when they put him off the train at the Deerfield station, he was highly indignant.

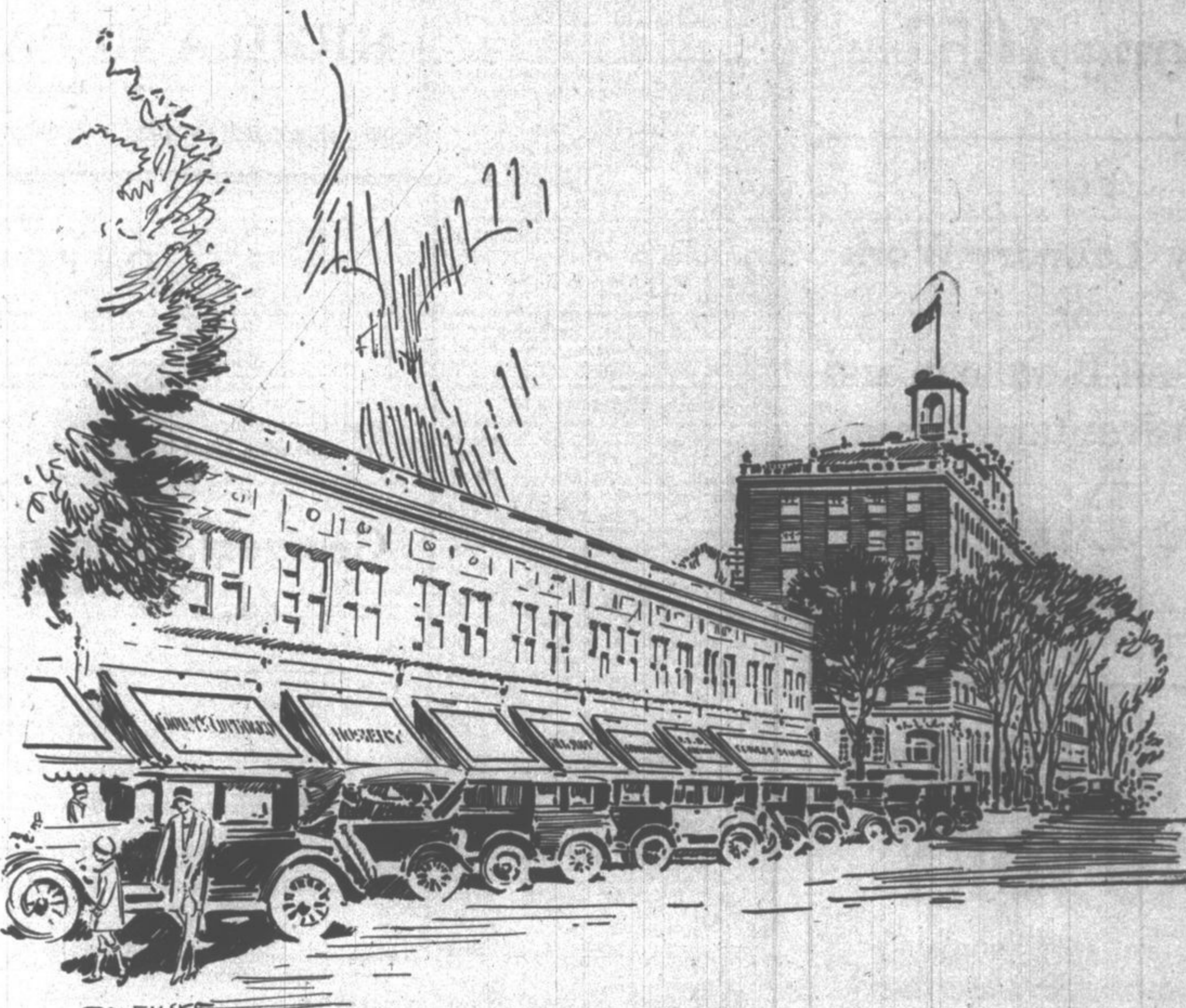
The detectives who arrested him claim that the man piled a lot of heavy chains, boxes of bolts and other articles on the track with the intention of wrecking the next train that came along. The stuff on the tracks, however, was discovered in time to flag a freight train that would have struck it in a few minutes. The stuff was removed and the service on the line continued.

Chrismarik was arraigned before Justice of the Peace Harry Hoyt in Waukegan and pleaded not guilty. The case was continued until Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock and being unable to raise the bond the man was jailed.
