SOLVE MYSTERY OF LAKE ZURICH BONES

The mystery of the five skeletons discovered a short time ago in oak grove at Lake Zurich by H. L. Prehm while excavating for his new building on Payne street, has been solved.

The skeletons, according to Floyd Gibbs of Palatine, are those of four members of a family by the name of Graves, and a man employed by them, all of whom died of smallpox in 1844.

An early settler by the name of Putnam, grandfather of Gibbs, was accompanied on one of his trips to Chicago by the head of the Graves family, according to the story handed down to Gibbs and related by him to Prehm. The trip was made by ox team, Putnam taking a load of wheat to market. On the return trip Graves fell sick at Jefferson Park, where they remained over night. Putnam took care of him and brought him back to Lake Zurich. A doctor from Dundee pronounced the malady smallpox. It took the entire family, Graves, his wife, two children and the hired man.

All were buried in a cemetery in oak grove. Ten years later the bodies in this cemetery were taken up and moved with the exception of those of the Graves family. No relatives of this family could be found and they were left where they had been buried.
