

**LAKE COUNTY READY FOR BIGGEST DAY**

OF EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS

**Tremendous Activity in Preparation for Mundelein Features of Meet on June 24**

"Lake county has been called upon and will not be found wanting," is the keynote which inspires the work of the executive committee functioning in this district for the International Eucharistic congress. The efforts of this committee are sanctioned and supported by George Cardinal Mundelein, sponsor of the biggest Roman Catholic festival ever staged in the United States, and its entire attention is concentrated in making a consummate success of the most important event of the congress—the procession of the Blessed Sacrament on Thursday, June 24.

**June 24 Big Day**

All activities of the big conclave will shift from Chicago and Cook county to Mundelein and Lake county on June 24. For months committees have been outlining plans for this great spectacle.

Every facility has been provided for handling the automobile problem. Culverts are being built so that cars may pass expeditiously from highways into the parking areas, which also are being provided with illumination, latrines, etc. The lighting facilities are to be installed in order to accommodate those who park on the grounds the night before and those who will be forced most likely to spend half the night of Thursday before conditions will permit the return journey.

Every facility will be provided for feeding the hosts and ample arrangements are being made for drinking water requirements. Water and gas will also be on hand for the automobiles. First aid and towing facilities are to be provided for car troubles.

**Road for Pedestrians**

In laying out the auto routes provision was made to bar all but foot traffic on Mechanics' road so that pilgrims may walk from Lake Bluff to the seminary grounds. It is the custom for many to cover a long distance by foot in making the pilgrimage.

Adequate railroad accommodations at terminal points also had to be provided. The Lake county executive committee have worked with the transportation lines in the erection of platforms and switches for the expedition of rail traffic.

**Tremendous Exodus**

Every avenue of transportation leading to Mundelein will be loaded to capacity. It is reported that the total rail transportation facilities will handle 275,000 people; 15,000 can be carried by the Soo Line, 30,000 by the St. Paul, 60,000 by the Northwestern railroad, with transfer to the North Shore line at Lake Bluff, and this leaves a balance of 17,000 to be handled by the North Shore line and the Rapid Transit line in addition to the 60,000 from Lake Bluff.

The co-operation of township officials throughout Lake county has enabled the committee to make definite plans for properly manning the rail lines and the automobile routes. Sheriff Ahlstrom will have hundreds of volunteers to insure proper policing and his needs are being adequately met by the citizenry.

morning, or check sent to The Ravinia Company, Ravinia, Ill., to reach the box-office by that time, and tickets will be mailed or held as may be desired. If reservations are made on the day of the performance for which they are desired, the tickets must be paid for at the box-office before 5 o'clock in the afternoon.

**Advanced Ticket Sales**

For the benefit of those who desire to order tickets in advance and who find it more convenient to have them

held until called for, an arrangement which has been entirely satisfactory in the past will be in vogue again this year. Under this plan those desiring such accommodations will make a deposit of \$20 for which a receipt will be given. Seats ordered in advance will then be held until called for at the box-office, but must be paid for at that time to leave the total amount of the deposit intact.

There can be no cancellations or exchanges, nor may depositors transfer their rights for the use of others, under this plan. When tickets so ordered are not called for, they will be charged to the depositor. These deposits may be made at the Ravinia box-office, or may be made by mail addressed to The Ravinia Company, 36

South State street, Chicago. The deposits will be returned at the end of the season in September.

Then comes the question of prices. The general admission at the gate is \$1, but coupon books are sold at \$18 for twenty coupons. Reserved seats for the opening, closing and gala nights of the season are \$2.25, \$3 and \$3.75. On all other opera nights the reserved seats sell at \$1.25, \$1.50, \$2, \$2.50 and \$2.75. On Monday nights, which are always devoted to symphony concerts, there is no charge for reserved seats, the \$1 general admission at the gate covering everything.

**Paradise for Motorists**  
In addition to the splendid transportation facilities it enjoys, Ravinia has always been a paradise for motorists, the roads from every direction stretching through the most beautiful portions of the North Shore. As a convenience to the thousands who arrive by motor car, two extensive parking spaces are maintained, one at the Sheridan road entrance and the other at the Green Bay road entrance. These are adequate in every way. A new and enlarged box-office has been established at Ravinia this season to facilitate the delivery of tickets which have been ordered by mail or telephone, on the evening of the performance.

In spite of the depressingly cold, wet weather of the past week the sale of subscription books for the Ravinia Opera season has gone merrily along and the promise of a record attendance is rapidly materializing.

The chairmen of the North Shore towns and the members of their committees have endeavored to reach every one interested in purchasing subscription books, but any who have been overlooked may secure tickets by telephoning the chairman of their respective towns. The price of the subscription books is \$18 for twenty tickets. For the Monday night symphony concerts there are no reserved seats. Reserved seats on other nights with the exception of the first night, the closing night and gala night are \$1.25, \$1.50, \$2.00, \$2.50, and \$2.75 and on the other nights mentioned they are \$2.25, \$3.00 and \$3.75.

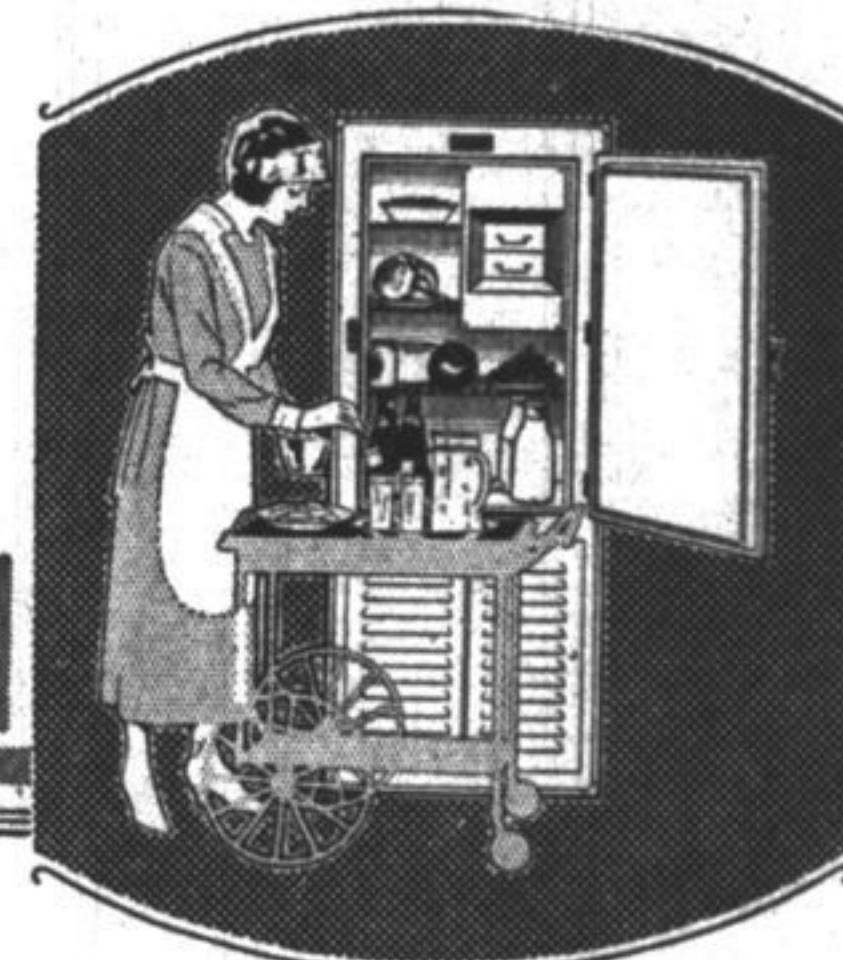

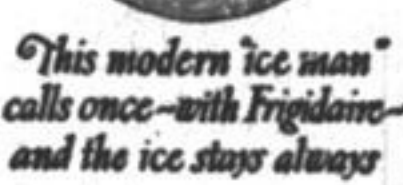
