STATES ATTORNEY'S QUARTERLY REPORT

Turns Over \$12,176.10 to County Treasurer; Notable Earnings Record

State's Attorney A. V. Smith turned over a check Saturday for \$12,176.10 to County Treasurer Ira E. Pearsall, his earnings for the period between February 1 and May 20.

The records of State's Attorney Smith show that during the last five and a half years, 183 persons, including a number of women have been sentenced to serve time in the county jail. The convictions were for violation of liquor laws, vice and gambling. The sentences ranged from 30 days to nine months.

Col. Smith says that more than 90 per cent of the fines was paid into the county coffers by violations of the prohibition law. This money goes into the school fund, being used entirely for educational purposes.

C. & N. W. OBJECTS TO PART OF TAX

Holds County Rate is Excessive; Protests West Deerfield Levy; Figures

Objections were filed last week in the county court by the Chicago & Northwestern railway through its local attorney, Hervey Coulson, against County Treasurer, Ira E. Pearsall.

The road objects to the following:	
1. Part of county tax	\$2,558.49
2. All Benton town tax	436.14
3. All Cuba town tax	242.32
3. All West Deerfield town tax	211.97
Total	\$3,448.92

The objection of the railroad to the county tax is that it is excessive, according to their bill. They claim that the county clerk extended a tax rate of 97 cents on the \$100 assessed valuation while the constitution of 1870 only provides for a 75 cent rate.

On the town taxes in the three townships they contend that the spreading of the tax was delayed to a point longer than allowed under the law.

John Austin, aged 81 years, mayor of Libertyville for three terms and known in every section of Lake county and northeastern Illinois for more than 44 years as a stock buyer and shipper, died at his home at 238 Park avenue in Libertyville at 2 o'clock last Friday afternoon.

Mrs. Mary Esther Larkin Crapo, of 1521 Belvidere street, Waukegan, died Friday night at seven o'clock at the age of 90 years.
