Why It Has Failed "The juvenile court has failed to stop crime because the community has overrated its possibilities, and has failed to recognize its limitations; and because the court has in most places failed to secure from the community the necessary reforms which would really prevent delinquency. At the same time, the juvenile court is a ster in the right direction, and must be thanked for pointing the way to the proper handling of behavior problems

before they reach the court. "The courts should have ample jurisdiction, but should not use it except where persuasion fails.
