ILLINOIS MOTORIST ASSN. HAS NEW HOME ON SOUTH MICHIGAN AVE.

Purchase of Building Adds to Accommodations for Traveling Public; Is Splendid Structure

Announcement has just been made by the Motorists Association of Illinois of the completion of a contract for purchase of the Standard club building and grounds at 2400 South Michigan avenue, Chicago.

All papers connected with the deal have been placed in escrow, and the formal deed of transfer of title will be signed on August 26.

The Motorists association will take possession of its new quarters about October 1, when the Standard club will move into its new building in the loop.

The six-story building, for many years occupied by the Standard club, is one of the best equipped clubs in Chicago.

On the first floor are located the library and lounging rooms, barber shops, cloak rooms for both men and women.

The upper floors contain the dining rooms and banquet halls, a large ball room with floor space to accommodate 500 couples.

AUTO IGNITION IS CLEARLY EXPLAINED HOW THE SPARK OPERATES

Process Followed by Expert For Motorist; Hints Given May Be Valuable

(By H. Clifford Brokaw) Ignition, compression and gas in the cylinders are required to start an automobile engine.

The gas is drawn into the cylinder by the piston moving out. The piston moves back in to compress it and the pressure of the explosion forces it out again.

If the spark occurs after the gas has been compressed and the piston has started to travel out of the cylinder and the power stroke has been partly completed this will also decrease the power delivered by the engine.

SPENDING COST IN GOVERNMENT SHOWN Expense of the Many So-Called Investigations By Congress Is Excessive

Representative Martin Madden, writing in Nation's Business Magazine, says that while the congressional inquiry is a useful and legitimate means of bringing out information upon which to base legislation,

It is apparent that a good part of the population is always quite ready to break home ties and seek the balm of change.

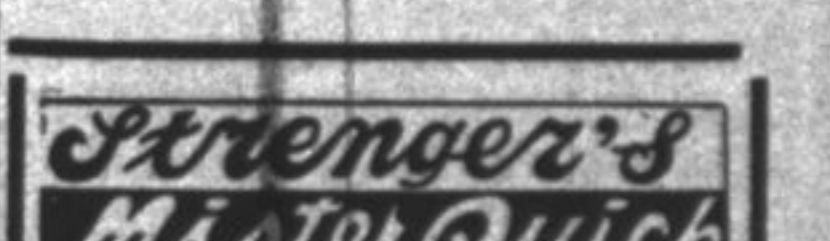

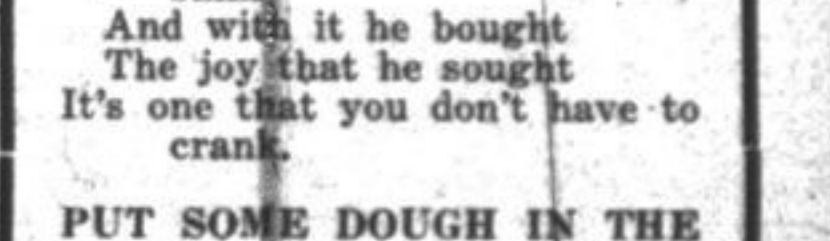

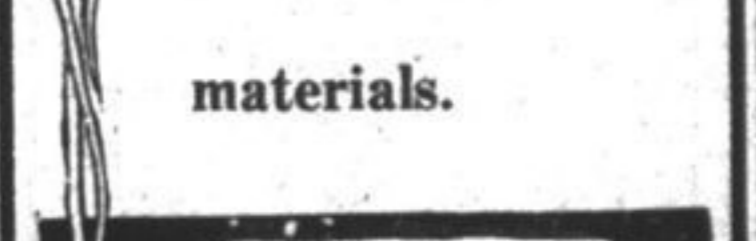
