If the spark occurs after the gas has been compressed and the piston has started to travel out of the cylinder and the power stroke has been partly completed this will also decrease the power delivered by the engine. Most of such loss consists of unburned gas which goes out through the exhaust valve and completes its burning in the muffler.

Particular Point There is a particular point in the travel of the piston where the spark should occur in order to give the best results. This point changes as the engine speed changes. In order that the spark may occur at the proper time in each cylinder an ignitor or ig-

The ignitor is equipped with a pair servcie, discounts on gasoline and oil, of interruptor points, one fixed and and similar benefits but they have the other movable. The movable one is operated by a cam which is driven through suitable gearing by the crank shaft of the engine. The spark is obtainable by bringing the movable HELPING COLLEGES point in contact with the fixed point and then separating the points. How It Operates The ignitor also has a distributor which directs the spark to the different cylinders in the proper order of their firing. #### SNOOPING COST IN GOVERNMENT SHOWN

Expense of the Many So-Called Investigations By Congress
Is Excessive

Representative Martin Madden. writing in Nation's Business Magazine, says that while the congressional inquiry is a useful and legitimate means of bringing out information upon which to base legislation, like all other good and useful things, it can be and is abused. This abuse, he writes, goes to the point of wasting public money and public time.

He cites the case of coal as one subject which has been dealt with lavishly by congressional committees. From 1913 to 1923, he points out, nine committees of the senate and eight committees of the house held hearings on coal. As a result he says more than 11,000 printed pages, five or six millions of words, were printed. In addition to the money expended for printing, he writes, there is another side that must be reckoned with. Congressional inquiries are time-eaters. A hearing calls busy men from all over the United States; sometimes it calls them back the next year to go over much the same ground.

"Many thousands of dollars," he adds, "have been spent on these 'special hearings,' much properly, but much on duplicated testimony. I have cited coal. That's only one instance. Think of agriculture, Muscle Shoals the Shipping Board, postal rates and salaries, the proposed department of education bill, radio. Prohibition i new on the list but perhaps we shall yet add it to our collection of hardy annuals, good for at least one crop of words to a session."

About Four Millions of Them Move In Spring at Price of \$68,000,000

About four million Americans cast off their moorings and sought new homes during the spring moving season. For this unwillingness to stay but another year they paid approximately \$68,000,000. Eye filling is the item of \$20,000,000 charged by truckmen for the transportation of household goods. And of course, the change of scene inspired the purchase of new furniture and new utensils, these two items accounting for \$40,000,000 in the total estimated amount of the bill Plumbers and fitters got \$4,000,000 for their services, and restaurants prospered by another \$4,000,000 paid for meals while household cooking facilities were out of commission.
