

NEW N. W. STADIUM READY THIS FALL

SO SAYS ANNOUNCEMENT

Twenty-Five Thousand Seats to Be Available For Opening Football Game Oct. 2. With S. Dakota

Northwestern university's big new stadium will be ready for the opening of the fall football season. This announcement, that gladdened the hearts of Purple gridiron fans, came last week from director of athletics Kenneth L. "Tug" Wilson, after the usual weekly conference with construction officials.

Twenty-five thousand seats are assured for the inaugural contest with South Dakota on October 2, with the seating capacity slated to increase until the temporary maximum of 55,000 is reached for the formal dedication contest, that with the University of Chicago on November 13. When conditions require, a third deck will be added and approximately 80,000 spectators will be provided for.

The contractors daily report that work is progressing satisfactorily. The strike of iron construction workers a few weeks ago, that slowed up all building work in the Chicago area, halted labor for ten days, but already this time has been made up and now the work is ahead of schedule.

The gridiron itself is finished. Several weeks ago the last seed was planted, the field was fenced in, and the key was turned over to Mr. Wilson. University employes are taking care of the grass now and safe footing will be assured the athletes next fall.

With the assurance given that the new structure will be ready for the crowds, Northwestern's greatest worry now is to build up a suitable 1926 edition of the Wildcat eleven to perform within its enclosures.

Many veterans will be back and with a strong sophomore class, prospects at this date are bright. Head Coach Glenn Thistlethwaite is away tutoring at summer football coaching schools, but will be back early in September, ready when the barrier is raised on Big Ten training on September 15.

CUTTING AFFRAY AT HIGHWOOD SUNDAY

Italian In Hospital With Bad Gash In Neck; Assailant Disappears

As a result of a quarrel over a card game in Highwood, according to Chief of Police Frame of that city, Vito Brandonisi was taken to the Highland Park hospital Sunday night suffering from a bad gash in the neck, reported to have been inflicted by another Italian resident of Highwood, who fled following the attack, it is said. Chief Frame has a warrant for the arrest of one, Pasquale Parnisimo. The story is that the injured man several days previously had won two dollars from the refugee and that following an argument over the matter Sunday night, the knife wielding Brandonisi's neck was struck and at last reported he was recovering.

HUNTING LICENSES SOLD IN ILLINOIS

More than half a million hunting and fishing licenses were sold in Illinois the past year according to figures made public by William J. Stratton, director of the State Department of Conservation.

Of the total of 618,562 licenses sold between July 1, 1925 and June 30, 1926—3821,062 were for fishing and 297,490 for hunting.

Illinois' record in conservation during the past four years has attracted many hunters and fishermen from outside the state. 16,534 non-residents bought hunting and fishing licenses during the past year.

The shipment of fishing, hunting, trapping and seine and net licenses for 1926-1927 to the county, city and village clerks will be completed this week. Judging from the original requisitions and repeat orders that are already coming in to the Department of Conservation more licenses will be sold this year than in any previous twelve month period.

This increase in the sale of licenses is due in part to the active and intensive enforcement of the law by the wardens in Director Stratton's department.

There is also a greatly revived interest in both hunting and fishing as a direct result of the constructive game and fish restoration work that is being carried on.

In addition to the purchase and establishment of eight fish hatcheries and two game farms, great quantities of both game and fish have been distributed throughout the state.

During the past four years more than five hundred carloads of fish, almost two hundred thousand pheasant eggs and more than fifteen thousand quail have been distributed in this state.

It is only natural that sportsmen should willingly buy hunting and fishing licenses as our laws wisely provide that all of this revenue must be spent for conservation of our game and fish.

MORRIS REICHELT IS INJURED IN HOLDUP

Bandit Knocks Him Down Saturday Night in Evanston; Is Recovering

Morris Reichelt, son of Mr. and Mrs. John A. Reichelt, of Wilmette (formerly of Deerfield) and captain of the Deerfield-Shields high school football team in 1923-24, was held up by a bandit while attending a party at the home of Miss Irma Gerske in Evanston with his fiancée, Miss Evelyn Cook, of Evanston, Saturday evening.

As Morris stepped out of the house a man attempted to take his money away from him, which was resisted, and a blow on the head with a revolver knocked Morris dazed. He staggered to his automobile and drew his own revolver and fired at the fleeing man, who returned the fire, but none of the bullets took effect.

The guests at the party ran out to find Morris injured and he was taken to St. Francis hospital, Evanston, where he was feared at first that concussion of the brain was possible. Mr. and Mrs. Reichelt, Sr., are at their summer home in Boulder, Colo., and the Reichelt home in Wilmette is occupied by Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Reed. Mr. Reed was Susie Cowlin, of Woodstock, a cousin of Morris, her husband was principal of the Woodstock high school, but now has a school in Michigan and is taking a post graduate course at Northwestern university. When Morris did not return Saturday night Mrs. Reed's intuition told her that something serious had happened. The first page of the Chicago Tribune was the first news that she received of the accident. On Sunday evening Morris was able to return to his home, and went to the Evanston police station to attempt to identify one of four men detained.

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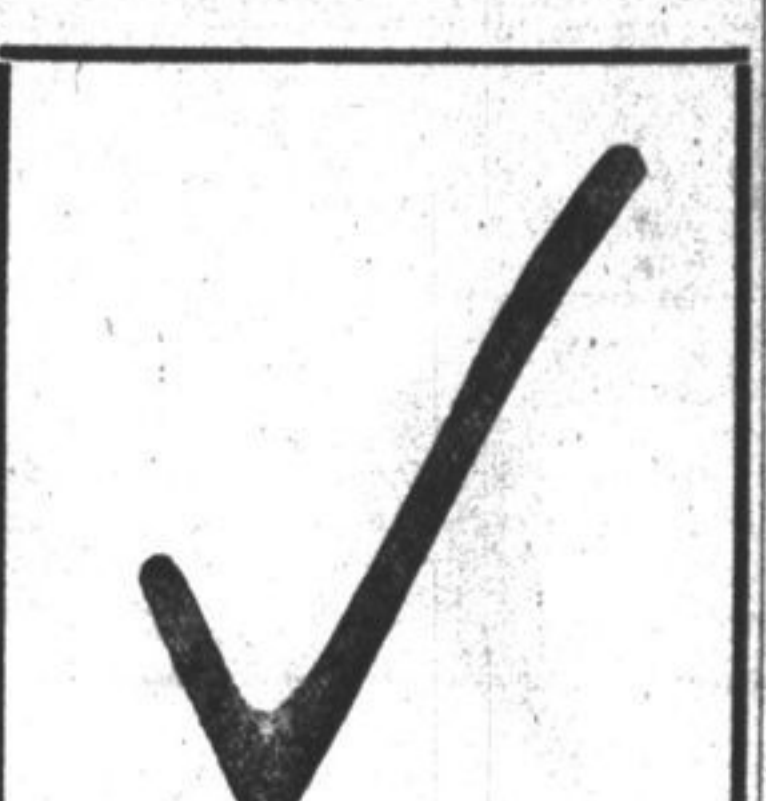
