

NEW BUICK MODELS ON DISPLAY HERE

Sixteen Body Styles With Many Notable Improvements; Great Cars

The new Buicks for 1927 are now on display in Highland Park at the show rooms of the North Shore Buick company at 110 South First street.

There are sixteen body styles, mounted on chassis lengths of 114 1/2, 120 and 128 inches. The line is made up of four sport type open cars, three sport type closed cars and nine other closed body styles.

According to factory officials, the Buick engineering department has developed a chassis which is built around Buick features of the past, but with additional improvements which in most cases are entirely new in the industry.

"The problem of period vibration has been solved in the new Buick," is the claim of A. C. Houser, manager of the local Buick agency. "This is accomplished by a counter-balanced, four-bearing crank shaft in combination with light cast iron pistons, a fly wheel of increased weight and a brand new Buick mechanical creation called the 'torsion balancer.'"

"Counter weights are used to keep the crank shaft from deflecting. They also balance the shaft so perfectly that there is no high bearing pressure or whipping out of line, which are the main causes of engine rattle, noise and roughness.

"Any crankshaft, no matter how scientifically worked out, has periods of torsional vibration. The Buick torsion balancer absorbs the tendency of the shaft to twist under the power impulses, and delivers these impulses back to the shaft after the piston forces are spent. In this manner it irons out vibration periods and gives the engine a smooth flow of power throughout the speed range. The light pistons and heavy flywheel help obtain this result.

"Among the most radical improvements introduced by Buick is one which now makes it unnecessary to change crank case oil more than four times a year. This is accomplished by a vacuum ventilator without moving parts, an air cleaner and oil filter which keep all abrasives out of the oil, with the help of a thermostatic temperature control. Numerous other improvements help to make the new Buick the greatest Buick ever built."
