Shall bonds of the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, in the sum of \$165,000.00 be issued by the council of the said City of Highland Park, for the purpose of constructing two bridges in North Sheridan Road in said City of Highland Park, one bridge spanning the ravine, cutting said Sheridan Road north of the intersection of Sheridan Road and Moraine Road, and one of said bridges spanning the ravine cutting said Sheridan Road immediately south of the intersection of Moraine Road and Sheridan Road, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent (4 1/2 %) per annum, payable semi-annually, to be dated September 1, 1926, and to mature \$16,000.00 a year on September 1, in the years 1927 to 1935 inclusive and \$21,000.00 on September 1, 1936, and a tax be levied to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds-all as provided by an ordinance adopted by the council of the City of Highland Park, on the 16th day of July, 1926, entitled "An Ordinance providing for the borrowing of money and the issuing of \$165,000.00 Bridge Bonds for the City of Highland Park, Lake County, Illinois, and providing for the collection of a direct annual tax for the payment of the principal of and interest on said Bonds?'
