Winnetka Woman Is Found on Beach Last Thursday; In Hospital

Mrs. C. G. W. Van der Hoort, 1092 Oak street, Winnetka, is recovering rapidly now in the Highland Park hospital, under the care of Dr. H. B. Roberts, following several days of anxiety regarding her conditions from the effects of a quantity of poison swallowed, it is believed by the police, with suicidal intent last Thursday on the beach in this city.

The police in neighboring towns were notified, and her husband soon was in touch with the local authorities. He told them that she had been in ill health and in a very nervous condition, and it is believed that this was the cause of the trouble. She is now well on the way to recovery.

**COUNCIL AND BOARD IN REGULAR SESSION**  
Continued from page 1

Commissioner Cheney moved that the bill of Alvord, Burdick & Howason in amount of \$174.95 for services in connection with supervision of construction of improvements at the waterworks during the month of June be approved for payment.

Commissioner Cheney moved that James Viti & Son, contractors for installation of cast iron pipe at pumping station, be allowed payment of \$630.83 in accordance with recommendation of the supervising engineers. On motion, also, Mrs. N. E. De Spain Murphy was allowed a refund of \$34.33 on building permit No. 905, in accordance with recommendation of the building inspector.

**Street Lights Added**  
Commissioner Gourley submitted a report on street lighting and moved that lights be installed as follows: Ravinia court, one light; County Line road, 15; Prairie avenue, four; Ridge road, 17.

Commissioner Card moved that James L. Fyffe, engineer, be employed to inspect the two north Sheridan road bridges and the Linden avenue bridge and submit a report regarding the same to the council at the next meeting; further that trucks be prohibited from using said bridges and that a limit of two and one-half tons be placed on the Linden avenue bridge.

**Pass Ordinances**  
Commissioner Cheney moved final passage of the annual appropriation ordinance, appropriating approximately \$270,000 for corporate purposes during the fiscal year.

Commissioner Card moved passage of an ordinance providing for construction of a connected system of cast iron water mains in Lambert Tree avenue, from Sheridan road to Grove-land avenue; also in Ruth terrace from Sheridan to Groveland, all in Ravinia Dells subdivision, the ordinance having been properly filed for inspection.

Commissioner Gourley moved passage of an ordinance providing for construction of a connected system of vitrified, salt-glazed, hub and spigot type tile pipe and cast iron pipe sanitary sewer for Ravinia Dells subdivision and also for lots 2 and 3 of a subdivision of lots 1, 15, 16, 17 and 18 of Lakeside Manor subdivision, the ordinance having remained on file as required by law.

**Appointed to Vacancy**  
Mayor Hastings appointed Clinton S. Beach as a member of the appeal board to fill vacancy.

Commissioner Card moved that the engineers be instructed to proceed with work of constructing sluiceways in South Sheridan road according to their recommendation.

Commissioner Cheney moved that the engineers' report on Sheridan road sidewalks be referred to the department of streets and public improvement for investigation and report.

Commissioner Gourley moved that the Chicago North Shore & Milwaukee railroad be notified to replace sidewalk between the tracks on Roger Williams avenue.

**To Inspect Sidewalks**  
Commissioner Gourley moved that the commissioner of streets and public improvements investigate and report regarding sidewalks in Roger Williams avenue, between Judson avenue and the railroad tracks.

Commissioner Cheney moved that the commissioner of streets and public improvements be requested to make survey and report on all broken and defective sidewalks that should be repaired or replaced.

**WIDER PAVEMENT ON NORTH FIRST STREET**  
Northwestern Making Improvement and Adding One New Switchtrack

First street, between Central avenue and Elm place, is being greatly improved by a wide addition for the entire length of the block, which is being done by the Northwestern railroad, which is widening the pavement up to their switch tracks to make it more accessible for team hauling freight from the cars. Permission was given the railroad company some time ago by the city council to build one additional switchtrack in the yards, and the railroad agreed to pave the entire area there up to the tracks. It makes First street one of the widest thoroughfares in the city as far as this block is concerned.

**YOUNG WOMAN DIES; HERE ONLY 5 MONTHS**  
Miss Edith Margaretha Asman, a resident here for about five months, died August 1st, at the Highland Park hospital. She was born in Norway and had been here only a few months, as indicated. Her only relative here is a brother, William Asman, who lives in Glencoe. The funeral was held yesterday, at the Prior chapel.
